BANKS TO TAKE STOCK

HEARST IS NOW AFTER MR. KERN. Reads Affidavit Coupling Bryan's Running Mate With Tom Taggart in Gambling Business.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Oct. 7.—Before one of the largest crowds that ever attended a political meeting in this city, W. R. Hearst Monday night read startling affidavits on the record and past life of John W. Kern of Indiana, Bryan's running mate.

Kern was shown as the confessed attorney for one of the largest gambling syndicates in the United States and as openly admitting that he owed his nomination to "Tom" Taggart, gambling house proprietor, whom Mr. Hearst termed the most corrupt political boss in the United States, next to Charlie Murphy of New York.

Kern Defended Taggart. That Kern defended Taggart's syndicate when arrested on gambling charges and that he gave out an interview in Indianapolis defending him personally, was also shown.

"If Bryan is elected," Mr. Hearst said, "it will be the first time that the White House has ever sheltered the confessed tool of gamblers and criminals."
