

OVER \$600 WAS IN THE BOXES

Charity Tag Day Was a Big Success on the Street Corners Thursday Morning and Afternoon.

TOTAL SUM OF \$617.79

Money Was Mostly in Small Pieces and it Took Two Men Two Hours to Get it All Counted.

Charity tag day proceeds were \$617.79.

The money taken in on Thursday by the young ladies who were stationed at the street corners and other places, was counted yesterday afternoon and after two hours of work, it was found that the amount had passed the \$600 mark.

The counting took place at the home of Mrs. E. S. Baker and all of those who had taken part in the big event were present, the affair being turned into a social function, refreshments being served after the amount had been counted.

The twenty red boxes, each one jingling with its contents, were brought forward, opened and the contents piled up upon a table while two gentlemen began the task of sorting out the money and counting it.

Three Big Bills.

There were three five dollar bills found in the boxes, the balance of the money being in silver and nickels and pennies. After it was all counted and made ready for deposit, there were six big bank sacks full of it.

The money counters began at 3 o'clock when the boxes were opened and it took two hours to get all of the money counted. There were hundreds of pennies and nickels and dimes and other pieces and a good many silver dollars, but the majority of the money was in small pieces, causing considerable time and patience to get it all sorted out and counted.





ILLINOIS SENT MANY PEOPLE

Travel Over the Keokuk and Hamilton Bridge Was Heavy as Was Shown by the Figures.

MANY THOUSANDS CAME

People Came From That State to Attend the Free Fall Celebration This Week.

Illinois contributed largely to the Free Fall Celebration crowds during the past four days of the fair. Figures furnished by John H. Cole, superintendent of the Keokuk and Hamilton bridge, show that travel for the first four days of the fair was practically the equal of last year.

On Thursday 202 one-horse vehicles and 84 two-horse vehicles crossed the bridge making a total for the day of 286. This is possibly one of the biggest days for vehicles crossing the bridge for some time.

The interurban bringing people from Warsaw and Hamilton carried a total of nearly 2,200 while the foot passengers will bring the total up to 2,500.
