The Keokuk party left here Sunday evening and spent Monday in Omaha, leaving there in the evening and arriving at Dallas on Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock.

The drawing for land begins on Monday and they are very anxious to hear from it. When they arrived 73,000 people had already registered and there are but 6,000 claims to be given away.

Upon medical examination it was found that the injuries are mostly confined to the head. Several scalp wounds were found and dressed but no operation was necessary. As yet no fracture of the skull has been found.
