



RECEIVER FOR EGG-O-SEE CO

The Egg-O-See Tangle is Ready Now to Be Straightened Out and the Business Continued.

LINEHAN IS IN CHARGE

Quincy Whig Got Excited and issued an Extra Edition Yesterday Containing the News.

The Egg-O-See affairs are still in a tangle, but it is being straightened out, for the company has passed into the hands of a receiver, John E. Linehan being named.

The Quincy Whig issued an extra edition on Monday telling of the appointment of a receiver and this morning, summed up the news of the developments as follows: Yesterday's Developments in the Egg-O-See Entanglement.

At Quincy—The local plant was placarded with notices, inside and out, "This Property is in the Hands of John E. Linehan, Receiver."

Attorneys William H. Govert and Theodore Pape, representing conflicting interests contending for the control of the concern, held a conference, but found it advisable to give out nothing for publication. Both are said to be anxious for the welfare of all concerned, to prevent a serious legal clash.

At Battle Creek—In the early morning hours of yesterday Circuit Judge North appointed John E. Linehan receiver for the Battle Creek Breakfast Food company (Egg-O-See concern) and its properties in Michigan. The application was made to cover a question as to technicalities.

At Buffalo, N. Y., Oct. 27.—Early yesterday morning John S. Kellner, representing John E. Linehan, receiver was appointed receiver of the company's property at Buffalo, on application of B. S. McCoy, a stockholder and manager of the Buffalo plant.

At Chicago—One wing of the stockholders and creditors opposed to the receivership instituted bankruptcy proceedings yesterday against the Battle Creek Breakfast Food company in the United States court, alleging liabilities of from \$400,000 to \$500,000 and assets of \$200,000.

In general—the stage of litigation reached proves conclusively the existence of contending factions, which, if not harmonized, it is feared, will seriously jeopardize the safety of the big industry and steps are now tending to bring about an adjustment of differences. In this connection J. W. Cassidy's sympathies are said to be with the Stecher Lithographing company, of Buffalo, one of the creditors bringing the bankruptcy proceedings. The hearing of the bankruptcy case will not take place, it is said for a considerable length of time, as it now stands on the United States docket, and good opportunity will be given for bringing the discordant elements to a better understanding before it is pushed to finality. In some quarters it is now claimed to have been instituted as a mere formality to bring about a better situation for mutual amities.

In the meanwhile the plant at Quincy will be operated. Fifty operatives were secured yesterday and they will return to work this morning.

Had a Big Time in the Y. M. C. A. Gymnasium With Physical Director Chamberlain in Charge.

THE EDUCATIONAL WORK

Commenced Last Evening With the First Class in Business Arithmetic—Others to Follow.

Physical Director Chamberlain of the Y. M. C. A. was highly elated last evening over the enthusiasm shown at the senior rally held in the association gymnasium. The rally was a big success and was attended by quite a number of members of the senior department. The class was organized last evening and the first gymnasium session provided much amusement for those present. Apparatus work was conducted by the physical director and the evening was brought to a close by a stirring game of basket ball.

Educational Work.

The educational work of the year commenced last evening at the association with the class in business arithmetic. This class is in charge of E. S. Patterson and is practical work in rapid and accurate calculation, the handling of fractions and various applications of percentages.

This evening classes in bookkeeping penmanship and business correspondence and architectural drawing will be held. Bookkeeping is in charge of W. A. Loeffler and is a thorough course in both single and double entry, with practical work in various lines of business. Penmanship and business correspondence is under the guidance of A. E. Parsons and is to guide a student to become a rapid, legible, business penman, the course also contains instruction in business forms, letter writing and proper use of words. The

architectural drawing course, under H. E. Ratcliffe, is designed to enable one to read correctly architectural "working drawings" and to make workings drawings and details for building construction.

Mechanical Drawing.

On Wednesday evening will be the mechanical drawing class under A. L. Lock. This course takes up both elementary and advanced work in use of drawing, materials, lettering, working drawings of simple objects, tracing, blue prints, etc.

On Thursday evening will be the electrical class under W. S. Davis, which will start November 5. On Thursday evening of this week the Boy's group course under Norris A. King covering elementary arithmetic, penmanship, spelling, geography, history and government, will commence.
