

### LEROY WOLF TO HEAD BOWLERS

Was Elected President of the Keokuk Bowlers Association at the Meeting Last Evening.

### BY-LAWS ARE ADOPTED

The Association is Open to All Bowlers of the City and Membership Will Cost Twenty-Five Cents.

The first annual meeting of the Keokuk Bowling Association was held last evening at the Keokuk club with an enthusiastic number present and officers for the coming year elected as follows: Leroy Wolf, president. T. P. Gray, vice president. C. H. Dickey, secretary-treasurer. The schedule whereby the season opens on next Monday was adopted at the meeting and also by-laws. An important fact concerning the signing of players is that all players must sign a contract given them by the managers. Until a bowler is first signed he may sign with any team, but after he has placed his name to a contract he must bowl with the team with which he has signed unless released by the manager. It is also provided in the contracts that no player may be traded by a manager after the first twelve games of the schedule have been played.

### The Prizes.

The prizes are as follows: Large pennant to team winning the championship, the pennant to be the property of the team, small pennant to each individual on the championship team, prize for the best three game average during the season, prize for high score during the season. The by-laws are as follows:

Keokuk Bowling Association. This organization shall be known as the Keokuk Bowling Association and shall be composed of six (6) clubs. The officers of this association shall be a president, vice president and secretary-treasurer, to be elected

at the annual meeting of the association; same to be held the second Friday in October of each year.

The membership in this association is open to all the bowlers of the city, and the annual dues for each member shall be twenty-five (25) cents.

The executive committee shall consist of the captains of the different teams. The rules and regulations of this association shall be those adopted by the American Bowling Congress, February 14, 1908, with the following amendments. Instead of alternating each frame, alternate at the end of each game, and the fifth frame of third game. All games must be played according to schedule unless postponed by agreement of the captains of both teams. Such postponed games must be played during the week in which they are scheduled, or forfeited.
