### THE WEATHER OF NOVEMBER

What the Records of the Office Here at Keokuk Show for that Month in the Past.

### THE WEATHER OF NOVEMBER

The following data, covering a period of 37 years, have been compiled from the Weather Bureau records at Keokuk. They are issued to show the conditions that have prevailed, during the month of November, for the above period of years, but must not be construed as a forecast of the weather conditions for the coming months.

Temperature—Mean or normal temperature, 39 degrees. The warmest month was that of 1899, with an average of 49 degrees. The coldest month was that of 1880, with an average of 31 degrees. The highest temperature was 79 degrees, on November 1st, 1888. The lowest temperature was 3 degrees on November 29th, 1872.

Precipitation—Average for the months, 1.90 inches. Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more. The greatest monthly precipitation was 3.91 inches in 1879. The least monthly precipitation was 0.21 inches in 1904. The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive hours was 1.34 inches on November 11th, 1881. The greatest amount of snowfall recorded in any 24 consecutive hours (record extending to winter of 1884-85 only) was 4.4 inches on November 30th, 1886.

Relative Humidity—Average 7:00 a. m., 80; average 7:00 p. m., 69. Clouds and Weather—Average number of clear days, 11; partly cloudy days, 11; cloudy days, 8. Wind—The prevailing winds are from the northwest. The average hourly velocity of the wind is 9.4 miles. The highest velocity of the wind was 42 miles from the north on November 1st, 1897.

Ed. S. Loftis, as clerk of the superior court and as deputy clerk of the district court, has proven himself the right man in the right place. As clerk of the district court he is competent, trustworthy and can well perform the quasi-judicial duties devolving on him in that capacity. If the people generally understood the facts, as those who are best posted do, his election would be nearly unanimous in the approaching election.
