

The Famous Keokuk "Lantern Club."

Never, no never, has there been such a popular organization in this city, as the Keokuk Lantern Club, organized but a few days ago and in which the membership now numbers easily 500 c:izens.

Over 350 members are shown on this page and there are a great many other members whose names were not secured.

There never was a club in Keokuk in which the members so much enjoyed their membership and during the short existence of the Club, but one unpleasant feature came up and that was the suspension of a member for conduct unbecoming a gentleman.

The Keokuk Lantern Club was organized on Thursday, October 22 when The Gate City, which was secured as the official organ, issued a call to all patriotic citizens to come to the aid of darkened Keokuk by hanging out lighted lanterns in front of their homes, or if they had incandescent lights upon their porches, to leave them burning during a greater portion of the night.

When the street lights were put out of commission by the accident at the plant, it became necessary for something to be done in Keokuk to dispel the inky blackness of the nights and the Keokuk Lantern Club was formed.

When the appeal was made to the citizens of Keokuk, there was a prompt reply, for Keokuk people are liberal, energetic, sympathetic and everything else thinkable. The lanterns sprung out like lightning bugs in a bog and each night there were more lanterns hung out until at the present time there is hardly a street in town which is not illuminated every night by many lanterns. Some of the members of the club leave their lanterns burn all night.

But there is hardly any use to repeat what everybody in Keokuk knows about the formation of the club and its purpose. Everybody knows about the club and everybody appreciates its splendid work.

Remarkable Growth.
The club was organized on Thursday when the announcement was made and The Gate City was secured as the official organ.

On Friday evening there were 17 members printed in the paper. On Saturday evening, the membership had jumped to 44.

When Monday evening's paper came out, there were 150 members enrolled. On Tuesday, the official organ had printed 236 names.

Wednesday's list brought the membership up to 321. Thursday's list made a total of 345. Last evening's official organ made the list go past the 350 mark by a good margin and tonight's issue shows for itself.

No organization has made such gains in Keokuk, unless it be the republican party, or the subscription list of The Gate City. It was a remarkable growth by a remarkable organization.

Serious for a Moment.
While the Keokuk Lantern Club has been a jolly organization, if it is thought of in a serious strain, it will be seen that it really has done, and is doing, a great deal of good.

There was a method in the madness of exploiting the club in a humorous vein, for in that way the people took hold of the matter good naturedly and possibly the results were better than had the first suggestion been made in all seriousness.

Those people who hung out lanterns and thus became members of the club, were anxious to read about the club and took more interest in the illumination of Keokuk.

There is no question but what the hanging out of lanterns in Keokuk the past few days, has prevented many accidents and possibly crimes. The Keokuk Lantern Club has "lighted the way."

At first the efforts of the Keokuk Lantern Club were taken as a kind of a joke, but as the really beneficial help of the club became seen, the smiles died down and everybody joined hands and declared the Keokuk Lantern Club to be a great and good institution.

With five hundred Keokuk people all interested in the club, the scheme has become the talk of the town and there has seldom been such interest in one thing as there has been in the famous Keokuk Lantern Club.

The Officers.
But enough of seriousness. The members of the Keokuk Lantern Club believe in two things—light and smiles—and they would rather read about the meetings of the board of directors, than read about the good being done by the club.

Who are the officers of this club? Who are the directors who have met each night and reported their meetings the next evening? Never have any of the officials of the club been mentioned in the paper and there is some desire among the members to know who they are.

The reports have mentioned a board of directors, a light inspector, the club detective, the club attorney and others.

The truth must out at last, so it is just as well to tell it now: THERE ARE NO OFFICERS.

So for the work of the club has been carried on by members of The Gate City force, who reported lanterns when they saw them and who

wrote the glowing accounts of the directors' meetings.
But why shouldn't the club have officers?
Let's have an election.

Election Called.
The board of directors hereby calls a special election of the members of the Keokuk Lantern Club and prints herewith an official ballot to be used. Clip out the ballot, fill it in and send it to The Gate City office by Friday noon of next week. On Saturday, the votes will be counted and the officers will be announced.

With a large membership, like the club has, it would be almost impossible to hold a meeting and so the referendum vote will be taken and every member is urged to vote.
It will not be necessary to sign the ballot, only put the names of your candidates down and send or bring the ballot to this office by Friday noon of next week. You do not have to register. Everybody can vote and everybody is urged to do so.
