Defect in Iowa Laws Leads to Abuses by Market Hunters—How the Game Law is Evaded.

Quail hunters were out in force yesterday and report fair sport, and it is believed the shooting will be found better later, says the Burlington Hawk-Eye. The bright, cold days of the last part of the month will probably put the birds on the wing...

Sportsmen point out that the market hunter is able to work toward the destruction of the quail, and the ease with which he does so, is pointed out by Deputy Game Warden Barmeier in a recent report...

"Iowa is infested with the market hunter, and he is the fellow that should be discouraged. Quail are shipped out of Iowa at almost all seasons of the year, and our shipping laws like all of the rest are full of technicalities.

"This law is gotten around nicely. We will take, for instance, a market hunter at Council Bluffs, who wants to get game through to some dealer in Dubuque. He simply takes his game across the river to Omaha and ships it to Dubuque, and we cannot seize the shipment, nor prosecute the shipper."

CONTAGIOUS CASES MUST BE REPORTED

Physicians Must Inform the Health Officer of All Such Cases.

The state board of health has defined what are considered contagious diseases and in the future all cases of such must be reported to the health department by the physician in charge.

The following definition of infectious diseases is given in the October Health Bulletin: "An infectious disease is one caused by a living micro-organism or germ, person those infectious diseases which are readily transmissible from one person to another or from man to the lower animals, or vice versa, are contagious diseases.

The following diseases, viz. scarlet fever (including scarletina and scarlet rash, diphtheria (including membranous croup), smallpox, epidemic cerebro-spinal meningitis, Asiatic cholera, bubonic plague, leprosy, measles, whooping cough, chicken pox, mumps, puerperal fever, typhoid fever, tuberculosis (including consumption) and pneumonia are hereby declared to be contagious and infectious diseases, and dangerous to the public health.
