




DEATH OF AN OLD CITIZEN

Mrs. F. L. Pardell Dies at Her Home in Franklin, Iowa, After an Illness of Only One Week.
RESIDENT FOR 55 YEARS

FRANKLIN, Iowa, Nov. 10.—Mrs. Katharina Pardall died at her home Saturday evening at 6:30 after one week's illness, at the age of 79 years, 7 months and 20 days. The deceased who has been in the best of health for years fell a victim to a paralytic stroke last Monday towards evening, while engaged with her housework and from that day until her demise grew weaker until the angel of peace came to relieve her from her suffering. Mrs. Pardall, nee Halfmann, was a native of Ellerstadt, Rheinfalz, Germany, and came to this country with her parents when a young lady during the forepart of the fifties. She was twice married, her first husband being George Mehl, who died within a few years after marriage. During the latter part of the sixties she joined hands and heart with her mourning husband, F. L. Pardall. She was a true Christian and a friend to all that came in contact with her. Besides her loving and aged husband she is survived by one son Louis C., four grand children, one sister Mrs. George Halfman of Kansas City, Mo., and Martin Halfman Cook of Nebraska, and many friends to mourn her departure.
