CONCERTED EFFORT FOR THE DESTITUTE

Rev. Giggler Believes That Charity in the City Should be Extended.

To the Editor of The Gate City: Now and then our attention is called to a case of destitution but these cases are more frequent than the public is generally aware of. The case of a helpless woman with eight children for which the overseer of the poor bespeaks the charity of the people goes to show that some concerted effort should be made to relieve the wants of the deserving poor. Unorganized effort as I have found out personally is just a little better than nothing. Some time ago a public appeal was made in behalf of an unfortunate family; estates kept pouring in for a couple of days and then the family was no better off than it had been before the appeal was made. The Benevolent Union of this city is doing a grand and noble work and ought to receive encouragement and a assistance, but private cases of family destitution are beyond its sphere of activity. A society called by some name like the Samaritan Relief society, having for its object the relief of deserving families and individual in distress would prove a great blessing to Keokuk. Only the deserving poor should be helped and without distinction of creed or color. I am willing to do my share in this work and I will cheerfully aid in the organization of such a society, of which I would be a humble member, leaving the official positions to others, distinguished by deeds of charity.

Perhaps the Benevolent Union could be induced to extend its sphere so as to include such cases.

UNCLE SAM IS AFTER POACHERS

Suit is Filed Here For Recovery of the Value of Timber Cut Down From United States Land.

RAND BOUGHT THE LOGS

Burlington Company is Sued For \$1,000 For Value of Logs Taken From Minnesota Lands.

Uncle Sam is after lumber poachers and a suit has been filed in the federal court here against the Rand Lumber Company which bought a lot of logs from a concern which is said to have secured the timber from government land without permission.

The petition filed in the federal court here by Marcellus L. Temple, United States attorney, for the April term, is entitled the United States of America vs. the Rand Lumber Company and is as follows:

The Petition.

The plaintiff for cause of action states: That in the logging winter of 1901 and 1902, the firm of F. W. Bonness & Co., a partnership consisting of Frank W. Bonness of Minneapolis, Minn., and W. H. Howe of Brainerd, Minn., cut and removed from lands belonging to the United States, described as the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter and the northwest of the southwest quarter of section 17, in township 142 north, range 32 west of the 5th p. m., in the state of Minnesota, certain pine lumber, more particularly described as about 77,960 square feet of white pine saw logs, and about 13,340 square feet of Jack pine saw logs, in all of the value of \$1,073.58, without permission or authority of the government of the United States, or any officer thereof; that said logs were cut and removed in violation of the law, and without authority, and constituted a trespass upon the public lands aforesaid then belonging to and owned by the United States.

That thereafter, to-wit, about the year 1902, the said Bonness & Co. transferred and sold said logs to the Rand Lumber Co., of Burlington who took possession of the said logs and removed and transported them to Burlington where the same were converted into lumber and by the said Rand Lumber Co. sold and converted to their own use and profit.

That the said Rand Lumber Co. acquired no title to said logs by virtue of the said purchase, and by the conversion aforesaid by them, became responsible to the plaintiff for the value of the said logs.

That the said F. W. Bonness & Co. are insolvent and irresponsible and no part of the value of said property can be collected from them.

That demand for the said sum has been made of the said Rand Lumber Co. and by them refused, and that no part of the said damages has ever been paid.

Therefore, plaintiff prays judgment against the said Rand Lumber Co. for the sum of \$1,073.58, with interest and the costs of this suit.


