### LANTERN CLUB HAS DISBANDED

The Board of Directors Officially dissolve the Great Organization at Their Meeting Last Night.

### A VOTE OF THANKS

All Bills Have Been Paid and the Club Goes Out of Business Free of Debt and Full of Honor.

The Keokuk Lantern club is no more.

Last evening, this famous organization went out of commission shortly after 7 o'clock when the board of directors met and after watching the arc lights burn steadily for twelve minutes, officially declared the Keokuk Lantern Club is disbanded, by adopting the following resolutions:

#### The Official Notice.

Whereas: The Keokuk Lantern club, organized October 21, 1908, for the purpose of enlightening darkest Keokuk, began in a humble way with but a few loyal members and

Whereas: The mission of the club has been completed, because of the turning on of the city street lights and there is no further use of the club's existence, therefore be it

Resolved: That the Keokuk Lantern Club is hereby officially dissolved, disbanded, broke, busted and wiped off the map.

Resolved: That the board of directors hereby officially extend a hearty vote of thanks to every loyal member of the club and believes that it speaks for the community at large in saying that the work of each member of the club has been greatly appreciated and that the club has done a great and noble work, which will remain a pleasant memory for years to come.

Resolved: That in case the city council allows the claim of \$500 now on file, that the money be divided among the club members later on, even though the club is officially disbanded.

Witness our hands, this 17th night of December, 1908.

#### All Bills Paid.

The directors decided to pay the few small bills owed by the club out of their own pockets, instead of making an assessment upon the membership and the club disbands free of debt.

After the resolution of dissolving had been passed, it was laid upon the table for a half hour and not spread upon the minute book until after the arc lights had been watched for a full hour, for the disbanding of the club was a matter which should be carefully considered and the directors did not feel as though they should be hasty in the matter. After it was seen that the street lights would burn and that Keokuk would likely be no longer in darkness, the resolution was ordered spread upon the minutes and the act was then officially passed.

### ENORMOUS PROFITS OF THE PULLMAN

New Charges Filed Against the Pullman Palace Car Company by Geo. S. Loftus.

CHICAGO, Dec. 18.—Geo. S. Loftus of St. Paul, filed an amended complaint against the Pullman Company with Interstate Commerce Commission Lane this afternoon. He alleges the company in nine years paid dividends aggregating \$51,665,848, the average annual return being 20 per cent. He alleged the profits were over \$5,919,900 yearly since 1901 and had been held back and put to an excess fund, to be divided when it reaches twenty-six million. He alleged that enormous administrative expenses were charged in order to conceal the profits. The greatest part of the earnings was divided between the stockholders, represented principally by the Marshall Field estate, J. W. Dean, S. A. Sprague, F. W. and W. K. Vanderbilt, J. P. Morgan, and a few others. He declared because of the abnormal profits and high rates the company controlled the sleeping car business in the United States.

During the morning session General Manager Dean testified the company list carried 572,000 passengers free.


