The earlier hours of the session were given to the completion of the clinics and the work that had been accomplished during the two days was placed on exhibition and was critically examined by the members. The business sessions were then in order and the Southeastern Society was first called to order. Following the reports of officers the subject of disbanding was taken up and freely discussed. A strong sentiment was found to exist against the proposed disbanding and yet no one could question the reasonableness of the position taken by President Vance. The uselessness of two societies, composed of the same members, in the same field, for the same purpose, was acknowledged. In spite of this fact many who had been members of the Southeastern Society were adverse to abandonment. The situation seemed almost like a parent killing his own child. So it was agreed that the society should remain in the field as an organization, but it is not likely that it will ever be active again. President W. W. Vance, of Ottumwa, is still president and a motion prevailed that the old officers be retained, not only by re-election but by common consent.
