

RECORDS SMASHED BY THE REXALLS

Three Marks Went Last Evening Before Great Pinning on Part of Younger Stars of the Game.

For a single high game mark Maas went 267 in his third game giving him an average of 200 2-3, the previous record being 193 1-3 held by Taber and Sheldon...

Maas the Star.

Maas without doubt gave the greatest exhibition of bowling of the year and the small, but enthusiastic audience was in an uproar when he set the high mark in the final game. His first game was 193 and his second 142. In the third the excitement began. The first ball was perfect and all pins fell. He repeated the stunt in the second, third and fourth, but in the fifth got a spare. In the next five frames he got strikes, giving him nine strikes out of ten frames and the high mark of 267. This is mark that not only stands in the league, but in the city.

Seal Skins Defeated.

The opponents of the Rexalls were the Seal Skins, it being the fate of that tall end club to go against great form. The match was lost by them by 340 pins, although good scores were made. Roberts went 212 but finished with a poor average. Brown, who has had little luck this season did his best work, going for an average of 165.

Every man on the Rexall team was in form with the exception of Irwin who had an average of 143. Merrill went 210 and had an average of 183.

WESLEY GAINS ESCORTS SHERMAN

Picturesque John Wesley Gaines of Tennessee Accompanies the Vice-President to the Capitol Building.

FITTED THE OCCASION

Monico Lopez Lara, Taft's Valet, is Attentive and Devoted to His Master—Other Inauguration Sidelights.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—With a halo of prematurely gray locks circling beneath the brim of a silk hat, whose luster far exceeded any other in the line of the parade—with the same picturesque demeanor that has always characterized even his minutest act in public—John Wesley Gaines of Tennessee today stepped down from his niche in the house of representatives and amid a blaze of glory, did his part in that ceremonious, albeit unnecessary, function of showing Vice President Sherman the way to the Capitol.

John Wesley's life as a congressman ended at noon today. No more picturesque figure ever sat in congress than Gaines. Absolutely irrepensible, fervid in oratory, pyrotechnic in his denunciations, spontaneous and acrobatic in his attitudes, and gestures, and easily a winner in any congressional popularity contest with the ladies, the Tennessee statesman precisely fitted the occasion as "an escorter." Of course the new vice president would have a hard time getting lost en route to the capitol, having served there some score of years, but the time honored custom of furnishing him a pilot had to be followed, and, moreover, some artistic touches.

John Wesleyans the latter. It was the master stroke of the Roosevelt administration—and John Wesley a democrat, too.

When Gaines got back to dear old Nashville, Tenn., he may tell his neighbors with truth, that he supplied a very large share of the "local color" of the inauguration.

A little brown faced man, whose small, black eyes danced with excitement and whose broad nose seemed to light up the white house grounds, dodged through the lines of guardsmen and policemen and made a bee line to get within sight of the new president.

"Who's that fellow?" cried one of the blue coats. "Don't let him get to near. Keep him back."

"Can't do it," shouted another. "He's the president's valet and says he has got to get next, so as to shine his shoes, or give him a new collar when he wites the one he's wearing."

So Monico "got next" and stayed "next" most of the day. He was within a few feet of the president during the inauguration ceremonies and the review and for four years to come unless something happens, he'll stay within range of the presidential eye, or th presidential voice. He followed Taft from the Philippines. He trod his footprints around the globe; he went with him to Panama; and asserts that he'll stick to him as long as they both live.

Monico Lopez Lara is a full blooded Filipino of the better class. He is 40 years old, looks 18, is soft of voice, indefatigable, loyal, fun loving and on the lookout for the American dollar. He has the commercial instinct deeply implanted in his system. This was shown up at Hot Springs, Va., where Taft sojourned before the late campaign. DYING CONGRESS LIVED UNTIL 1:03. Much Confusion Took Place in the House of Representatives at Final Session.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—On the eve of the final adjournment of the house yesterday transacted its business with facility unusual for a dying congress, although at times there was much confusion which the speaker had difficulty in controlling. With scarcely any debate the conference reports on military academy, legislative, executive and judicial and penal code bill was agreed to.

The bill amending the copyright laws of the United States in regard to "canned music" passed, as were also a large number of private bills.

Having practically wound up the consideration of all other pressing business the house at 6:15 recessed until 10 tonight.

One of the first things done at the night session was to agree to the conference report on the general deficiency bill. A number of miscellaneous measures were also put through.

Shortly before one o'clock this morning, (Thursday) Tauney presented the conference report on the sundry civil bill which was agreed to after a brief discussion. At 1:03 a. m. the house recessed until 10 today (Thursday.)
