

# WATER POWER MEETING HELD

Stockholders of the Keokuk and Hamilton Water Power Company at Hamilton This Morning.

## INTERESTING CAPITAL

Mr. Powellson Left New York City Today For London on Business Connected With Financing of Project.

P. Allen, Dexter Cooper and John Hunter were in the city today for the purpose of attending a stockholders' meeting of the Keokuk and Hamilton Water Power Co. The meeting was held at the State bank in Hamilton, the company being organized under the laws of Illinois. Messrs. Allen and Cooper are from New York City and Mr. Hunter from St. Louis, the latter being a director in the Keokuk and Hamilton Water Power Co. The meeting was a formal one, held to comply with the law. Mr. Allen is private secretary to Mr. Cooper and Dexter Cooper is a brother of Hugh L. Cooper, and an hydraulic engineer. All of the above gentlemen will return to their respective homes tonight.

### Interesting Capital.

The work of financing the Keokuk enterprise is in progress. At the present time the money has not been assembled for this stupendous project but it has been presented to a number of financial men who all give their endorsement and express their interest in the enterprise. It is believed that as soon as the tariff agitation is over and the Aldrich-Payne bill passed, conditions will improve so that Messrs. Cooper and Powellson can get the money together and build the dam. Its feasibility and value is readily admitted by those who have investigated the project.

Mr. Powellson leaves New York City today for London where he will continue the work of enlisting capital. The gentlemen who were here today express their confidence in the success of the enterprise and Mr. Hunter says that St. Louis has no other expectation but that of getting some of the power from the Keokuk dam. The gentlemen regard the outlook favorable.
