If the boy comes out without a scratch, he is that much ahead. On Wednesday of last week it fell to the lot of Marshall Stanton, son of Rev. G. A. Stanton, to go over the dump. When the boy fell, he struck some sharp substance cutting a long and ugly gash on his face from which he bled profusely. The boys accompanied him to the office of Dr. Platter, who dressed the wound, being compelled to take four stitches in order to bring the broken skin together. The boys themselves, who hazed the Stanton boy, did not expect such serious results and were thoroughly alarmed when they saw his injuries.

—The Iowa Christian Endeavor society has reached a decision to devote more time to prison work. This will be done by providing workers to visit the penitentiary and reformatory and by getting good literature in the hands of the prisoners. Furthermore the membership of the society and the people generally will be educated to this work by the society deciding to devote at least two Sunday evening meetings each year and possibly as many as one each month to a study of the prison work. The conditions of the Iowa institutions is perhaps as good as any in the Union. But since the state adopted the policy of trying to reform the criminal the field for work is unlimited. Under the old idea that the only thing to do with a prisoner was to punish him there was no room for prison work.
