
FARMINGTON.

SONS OF VETERANS ASKED TO JOIN

An Effort Will be Made to Enroll Every Son in Keokuk into the New Camp.

E. P. McManus, elected Commander of the new camp of Sons of Veterans, which has been formed in the city, has issued his first order, which is in the shape of an appeal to every son in the city, eligible to join, to become a member of the new camp which is to be perfected at some meeting in the near future. The order is as follows:

To the Sons of Veterans of Keokuk and vicinity. This opportunity is taken to advise you that a camp of S. of V's was organized in this city Friday evening, Oct. 22nd, 1909. The necessary number of members having been secured to entitle the camp to a charter. Those who have taken up the movement have every reason to believe that every son of a Soldier Sire is imbued with the same patriotic feeling and reverence for the deeds of their Fathers that they have, and will gladly become Charter Members. We have before us the names of all Sons of Veterans in the city a committee has been named to secure members; that committee is going into their work with enthusiasm and determination and will not be satisfied until every man eligible to membership is enrolled. We ask you to make that committee's work as light as possible as they are men of business whose time is fully occupied with their own personal affairs, therefore you are asked to be on hand at the office of Hon. COMING FIGHTS ON LOCAL OPTION

Thirty-Three Cities in Illinois Effecting Eleven Counties Will be Included.

Thirty-three cities in central Illinois, which represent eleven counties on Nov. 2 will vote on the question of whether they will have saloons or not. Jacksonville is the largest city among the number and it is there that the fiercest war will wage between the opposing forces. Next spring the same question will be put to vote in other cities in other sections of the state, and it is in Decatur, the largest city, that the hardest fight is expected.
