

BOWLING SEASON TO OPEN TUESDAY

Final Arrangements Have Been Made, Schedule Adopted and Bowlers Await Clash of First Night.

AN 18-GAME SCHEDULE

One Has Been Drafted Which Should Give Perfect Satisfaction to Every Club in the League.

The second season of the Keokuk Bowling association will open Tuesday, November 2, with games at the Keokuk Club and the Rexall at the Drexel alleys, and the Grand Leaders and Olympia at Olympia alleys.

The league as it is now organized is composed of ten clubs as follows: Keokuk Club, Seal Skins, Rexall, Drexel, Grand Leaders, Selberts, Olympia, Well, I-Bron and Ewers-McCarthy. There is a slight doubt as to the last named team, but it is thought the firm will have a team to represent it when the opening game is played.

The schedule which has been adopted calls for eighteen games. The first games will be played on the date mentioned above and the last games on March 2, making the season of just such length as is desired.

Each team plays the other nine teams twice during the season, and the games on the alleys are divided equally. Special arrangement was made in order that the Keokuk Club team can bowl one-half their games at home, thus giving every club the opportunity of bowling on the Keokuk Club alleys once during the season and at the same time bowling the Keokuk Club team once on one of the downtown alleys. The playing dates are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Contracts have been placed in the hands of the various captains and they are requested to sign their players as early as possible and have the teams on hand for the opening games. Fifty cents is the cost of a membership in the association and this amount for each player. A deposit of \$10 initiation fee, should be given to President Leroy Wolf, at the State Central Savings bank, on or before Tuesday of this week. Mr. Wolf has also been made treasurer of the association and any league money at hand should be remitted to him and a receipt obtained.

Prizes. As there will be more than \$100 in the treasury at the end of the season, a special feature of the year will be the special prizes which have been offered. They are cash prizes, except in the case of an amateur and then the prizes will be other than cash. Here they are:

- 10 per cent for second high team average.
- 5 per cent for third high team average.
- 20 per cent for high individual average; bowler must roll in twelve of the eighteen games.
- 10 per cent for second individual average.
- 5 per cent for third individual average.
- 10 per cent for high individual average for three games.
- 5 per cent for second individual average for three games.
- 10 per cent for highest number of consecutive frames filled without an error, splits not counted as errors.
- 5 per cent high individual game.

Handicap Counted. It must be remembered that in the above averages and special prizes (only in team averages) the handicap system holds good, thus giving a man on a weak team almost an equal chance for a division of the money.


