HARRY THAW CREATED SCENE

Wanted to Eat at a Certain Place and Got Nasty While Arguing the Matter.

NEW YORK, Nov. 17.—Harry K. Thaw, who was brought here from the Matteawan asylum for the criminal insane, to testify in the suit of Dr. A. McLane Hamilton to recover from Mrs. Mary Copley Thaw \$7,000 for professional services created a scene at the court house over the question as to where he should eat lunch.

The officers in charge were taking him to a restaurant near the court building but Thaw insisted upon going to a place in the financial district where he lunched frequently before the killing of Stanford White. He became so noisy that a large crowd collected, and Dr. Baker of the asylum was obliged to interfere.

The suit of Dr. Hamilton will be tried before Justice Dowling, who sent Thaw to Matteawan.

Shortly after the beginning of the trial a clerical error in the papers to the suit was discovered. This caused a mistrial. The court ordered the trial stopped and the jury withdrawn. Thaw was not called to the stand. He was returned to Matteawan asylum.

TEN MEN KILLED IN A CAVE-IN

Construction Gang Engulfed and Only One Man Was Saved From the Accident.

WINSTON-SALEM, N. C., Nov. 17.—Ten workmen are known to have perished and perhaps several others met the same fate when a cave-in on the new extension of the Norfolk and Western Railway at Salem Creek, engulfed a construction gang.

A rescue party immediately began digging, with the hope of reaching the ill-fated workmen before they had suffocated, but the rescuers were successful in saving but one man of the laborers.

The bodies of seven of the workmen, who had been smothered under the tons of earth before the rescuers reached them, have been recovered.

Thanksgiving Pardons.

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., Nov. 17.—Governor Hadley will revive the custom discontinued in this state by Governor Folk of making holiday pardons. These pardons are always given to long-term prisoners whose conduct has been exemplary in prison and who have shown evidences of complete reform. The governor is working on the Thanksgiving pardons now. He commuted the sentences of two men to parole them on November 20. They are Edward Mason and Edward Campbell, a negro. Two boys, Walter Galbreath, aged seventeen, and Howard E. MacDonald, were ordered transferred to Booneville.
