CITY NEWS

The police received a call from between Johnson and Main on Third, about 9:30 last evening, where William Joyce had fallen down the long flight of wooden stairs at the rear of the Lowitz tailoring establishment. The man was badly cut and bruised up in his side down the steps, a deep gash on his skull, about three and a half inches in length, his lip was cut and required several stitches and his left hand was quite badly bruised. The blood flowed freely from the first two named wounds and when picked up Joyce was in a dazed and bloody condition. He was hurried to the office of a physician where he was given medical attention, his wounds being sewed up.

A fire which might have resulted disastrously to the Hulskamp Shoe factory was extinguished by the prompt action of one of the employees yesterday morning. The incident occurred in the finishing room of the factory, it being in charge of girls. It so happened that the fumes coming from some rubber cement which is dissolved by an acid came in contact with the flame from a lighted gas jet and in an instant there was a big blaze which threatened to spread over a large area. The girl who was in charge became excited and ran. Some of the cooler heads of the employees however rushed to the scene with buckets of water and a patent fire extinguisher and quenched the flames before they had eaten their way very far. Had it not been for prompt action a serious fire might have resulted as the room in which the blaze started would make good food for flames.

MASON WASN'T ABLE TO COME

Harry W. Mason Will Not Address the Men's Meeting at the Y. M. C. A. This Afternoon.

The religious work committee finds it necessary to make a change in its plans for the remaining November meetings inasmuch as Mr. Harry W. Mason, of Bloomington is unable to speak at the Men's meeting this afternoon. The committee regrets exceedingly to be compelled to change its plans after announcement has been made and the meetings so advertised, but they are pleased to announce that Professor S. N. Carpenter, formerly of Pittsburg, Pa., but now associated with the college of Carthage, Ill., has been secured to make the address today.

Mr. Carpenter was formerly pastor of St. Stephens church, one of the most prominent in Pittsburg. He is professor of history and English in the Carthage college and being a young man is very popular with the students. In Pittsburg he was secretary of the Inner Mission and was at the head of the great slum work in the Smoky City. He has always been a very popular speaker in connection with Young Peoples Christian Endeavors and church leagues and the

Young Men's Association, considers itself very fortunate to be able to make the announcement of the change in the program.

Mr. Fred B. Smith, international religious work secretary, has had his eye on the Keokuk association for the last three years and expects greater work from the committee in his department and in view of this fact, those in charge of the Sunday afternoon meetings are doing their best to bring able speakers to the city and thus far this season the addresses have been high-class and very helpful.

An urgent invitation is extended to men of the city and especially to young men to avail themselves of the opportunity of being present on each Sunday afternoon at 3:45. Special music is often provided and more encouragement from Keokuk citizens is needed in this good work. The Y. M. C. A. is trying to make this season the best in its history.

Those who have heard Hon. T. D. Foster of Ottumwa will be glad to know of his coming to Keokuk to speak to them on Sunday, Nov. 28. He is president of the Morrell Packing company of that city.

THE CENTER OF THE EARTH

How the Zuni Indians Have Marked the Supposed Spot by a Crude Shrine.

In the Zuni cosmogony, the earth is conceived of as flat, and shaped like a pancake. Being a chosen people of the gods they were commanded early in their tribal career to go to the exact center of the world, and there build their homes; and one of the most interesting legends of the people relates the story of their wanderings in search of the middle place, and tells how they knew it when they reached it. It is about 200 yards south of their village in western New Mexico, 35 miles south of Gallup, on the Santa Fe route. It is marked by a crude shrine, built like a bake oven, out of flat stones. Two large removable flagstones close the entrance, which faces the rising sun. On the top are a number of concretionary formations, known to the Indians as thunder stones. In the interior are large numbers of feather tufted prayer sticks, and several earthenware vessels filled with sacred meal. Numerous ceremonial dances, in the nature of rainmaking rites, are performed around this holy place.

"Kussim." Forty-one Georgians stood around the death-bed of old Mr. Perkins, their rich relative, and shed tears as the hand of death was laid upon his brow. When the will was opened, and they found that he had left all his property to found a college, 41 Georgians started for home exclaiming: "Kussim."
