

### DIED AT THREE THIS MORNING

John Martz Who Resides on the Johnson Street Road Died at an Early Hour This Morning.

### WAS BORN IN GERMANY

Had Been in This Country For Over Forty Years And Was Well Known in and Near Keokuk.

After an illness which he had endured for over a year, John Martz, a well known resident on the Johnson Street road, passed away this morning at his home at three o'clock after a last struggle. The cause of death is not exactly known, though cancer of the stomach is thought to be chiefly the reason for his demise. A post-mortem examination will be held today or tomorrow to determine.

Born in Wurtemberg, Germany, July 1th 1846, John Martz came to this country when but a young man in his twenties. He came to New York City where for five years he resided before locating on his farm near this city, where for the past thirty-five years he has made his home. Had he lived until next July he would have been sixty-four years of age.

He was a member of the St. Mary's Catholic church and was a regular attendant at that house of worship when good health permitted. By occupation, he was a farmer. He was well known in Keokuk and vicinity, and his passing will be mourned by a large number of friends.

Those who survive him are his wife, five sons and five daughters. The sons are, Sebastian of Sioux Falls, South Dakota; John of Wivau, Mont.; George of Satula, Okla.; and Frank and Joseph of this city. The daughters are: Sister Mary Delourdes and Sister Mary Henrietta of Mercy Hospital, Davenport, Sister Mary Philomena of Benedict Convent, Mo., and Misses Margaret and Katherine Martz of this city.

Arrangements for the funeral have not yet been made but will be made later.

### MONDAY MUSIC CLUB'S EFFORT

Chorus for the Messiah Which is to Be Presented in December is Being Gotten Together.

The Monday Music Club is making an effort to organize its chorus, preparatory to giving the Messiah on December 27th, under the direction of Dr. W. F. Bentley of the Knox Conservatory. The intention is to give this oratorio on a larger, more magnificent scale than any other musical production that has ever been given in this city. Whether this can be done depends largely on the individual members of last year's most efficient chorus.

If they have enough enthusiasm for the work, and will rally to the support of Dr. Bentley and the chorus committee, Keokuk will still own a chorale organization which would do honor to a city many times its size. If it is allowed to fall through now it will have fallen through for good, for no one intrusted will have the courage to



face the work involved in resurrecting a dead organization.

The plan contemplated for this year requires a less expenditure of time and money for each member, than in any previous year. Mr. Bentley is a busy man, with more demands on his time and strength than he can possibly fill. Upon the repeated solicitation of the Monday Music club, he has made it possible to give the chorus six rehearsals. To quote Dr. Bentley's own words:

"I believe six good rehearsals will put the Messiah back again where it was, providing the old members are there and attend regularly. I am urging myself a good deal to agree to come, but I can't see you stop, when the enthusiasm is so great." Whether Dr. Bentley is correct about the degree of enthusiasm is yet to be seen.

Of course some new members will be added, and anyone who is a ready reader of music, or familiar with the score of the Messiah will be admitted.

The cost per member this year is much less than last, and is the minimum fee which the expenditure warrants.

If a sufficiently large membership can be secured the cost per member will be \$1.75 and in no case will it exceed \$2.00.

This small fee includes membership in the Monday Music club and is only made possible by that financial backing which the club guarantees to the chorus. It does not mean that anyone joining the chorus is compelled to become a member of the Monday Music club. Membership in the club is granted any member of the chorus who cares to avail himself of that privilege, but there is no extra charge. In either case the fee is the same, and if the Music club did not stand ready to cover any deficit which the fees, either at \$1.75 or \$2.00 are absolutely inadequate to cover, the price for the chorus alone would be much higher than it now is for both.

This is an appeal to the old members of the chorus, to all musicians and music lovers, and to all citizens interested in Keokuk's enterprise and progress, to support the club in its effort to sustain the chorus, which did such splendid work last year.

Please send word to Mrs. C. R. Joy of your intention to join the chorus. If you cannot be an active member it is solicited that you become a supporting member, which means that by paying the chorus fee you secure the privilege of club membership and admission to all chorus rehearsals.

Dr. Bentley himself gave unqualified praise to the chorus last year, pronouncing the work that was done by them to be the best chorus work ever done in the Messiah, under his leadership. If you do not sing or demands upon your time prevent you from becoming an active member become a supporting member and report to Mrs. Joy at once.

### BRAWL YESTERDAY ON THE LEVEE

Officer Henry Schevers Arrived Just in Time to See Illinois Man Take the Count of Ten.

### HIT BY RESTAURANTEUR

Frank Rickards and Ross Carroll Had Brief Mixup in Restaurant, Corner of Main and Levee.

Officer Henry Schevers, the man whose duty it is to maintain peace and quiet among the disturbing elements of the levee district and who is often summoned to quell altercations which arise from day to day, alert during the twelve hours of duty, rounded the corner yesterday afternoon about 3 o'clock, just in time to see Ross Carroll, who resides in Hancock county, come whirling backwards through the door of Frank Rickards' restaurant, corner Main and the levee. The punch was delivered by the proprietor himself and was of telling effect.

The blue coat lost no time in placing both men under arrest and both were brought to the station and locked up. Rickards was released after \$25 bond had been furnished, but Carroll was compelled to remain in jail.

### Sandwich Starts Fight.

According to a story told by the restaurant proprietor the fight was provoked by the Hancock county man and was the result of the purchase of a sandwich. Rickards says that Carroll came into his place and bought a sandwich—at least he obtained one under the guise of having money to pay for it—but that he left the restaurant without "coming across" with the necessary piece of coin.

A short time later the same fellow came into the restaurant again and was refused what he called for, Rickards evidently not wanting to lose anything more on his customer. This provoked the Illinois man and he left the place in an angry mood, later returning according to Rickards with a brick in his hand and bent upon evil doing.

### Rickards Moved With Speed.

Rickards lost no time in moving and at an opportune time and before the other man was aware of it, had planted a heavy right over the man's eye with such force that it sent him sprawling through the doorway and almost cut into the street. The blow had the effect of coloring his eye and cutting a gash near the optic. Schevers interfered before the battle could be resumed.
