PIERCE IS A MANAGER

Catcher Who Worked for Burlington a Part of Last Season, Will Handle Appleton Club Next Year.

It looks as if Manager Ned Egan, who goes to Ottumwa, fortified with some of the best of last season's Burlington team and with a number of strong players of last year's Ottumwa team, will have an edge on Manager Geler, of the Pathfinders, who is now the Burlington manager as announced in The Gate City yesterday.

It is certain that Outfielder Finney, First Baseman Rose, Pitcher Boyd and Catcher Severoid will go with Egan and it is also reported that John House will be back in the fold. It is a well known fact throughout the circuit that Ottumwa last season had some of the best players in the Central Association. The great difficulty during the entire season was the lack of a manager and this great loop hole has now been filled.

What Geler, the new man, will do is hard to surmise, but there is little doubt but that he will make the Pathfinders a strong club. He is a ball player with long experience in higher leagues than the Central Association and it should not be hard for him to secure proper material for a class D club.

Quincy is the only club in the league now without a manager and Hofer will likely secure a man before many more weeks have passed. It is thought that he has delayed this because of the unsettled conditions in Quincy.

Bemis Pierce, who worked behind the bat for Burlington part of the time last season will be a manager next season. He has been signed to handle the Appleton team in the Wisconsin-Illinois league.
