IOWA ONCE INFESTED BY "HOSS" THIEVES

A Bad Gang of These Villians Rained Throughout Northeastern Section of State.

In northeastern Iowa there once operated one of the most desperate gangs of horse thieves and counterfeiters that ever lifted stock or bogus paper. They numbered also among their misdeeds, burglary, highway robbery, and not infrequently murder, and were part of an organized band of criminals who maintained stations in Illinois, Wisconsin and Michigan and assisted each other in disposing of their ill-gotten gains far from the scene of the crime.

The story of how the station was broken up and the operators driven by violence out of Jackson county, Iowa, is graphically told in a publication just issued by the State Historical society of Iowa. The book is a biographical volume by Harvey Reid on Colonel Thomas Cox, an early settler and pioneer legislator of Iowa. A gang of men, under the leadership of W. W. Brown, a hotel keeper in Bellevue, Jackson County, had so enraged the settlers by depredations and crimes for which it seemed impossible to convict them that on April Fool's Day, 1840, the county sheriff and Colonel Cox gathered a force of forty men and stormed the Brown hotel where the miscreants held defiant possession. Guns were in play in a trice and there were killed and wounded on both sides when the conflict ended. Several of the gang escaped but thirteen were captured. Voting by means of red and white beans on the question of hanging the captives, the decision was finally made to whip them on the bare back and send them down the river in oarless boats. They never returned to the scene of their bloody defeat, although other parts of Iowa later suffered from their crimes.

OF INTEREST TO QUAIL HUNTERS

Illinois Sportmen Cannot Have More Than Twelve Birds in Their Possession.

Quincy Herald: Illinois hunters whose practice it has been in the past to go out and return home with the bagging of quail of several days will have to discontinue the custom if the statute as interpreted by Attorney General Stead is enforced. Inquiry came to the attorney general's office several days ago on the question whether it is really legal for a hunter to be found in possession of more than the daily quota of twelve quail, as prescribed by law, and the office looked into the law, with the foregoing conclusion, issued today.

It is held illegal by the attorney general for a man to be found with more than twelve dead quail in his possession, whether they represent the bagging of an hour, a day or a week. It is not a question, therefore, of the number shot daily merely, but of the number which may be found in a hunter's possession at any one time.

The decision may affect radically the practice of many hunters in this and other sections of Illinois, who all season have been accustomed to go out for several days and bring back the results of the whole time.
