Steamer Cantonia Passes Through the Draw About Noon on Way to the Canal.

HAS A HAZARDOUS TRIP

Ice in the River Makes Travelling Dangerous—Bridgemen Have Big Job on Their Hands.

The last boat of the season to pass Keokuk did not do so until about noon today when the little ferry Cantonia passed through the draw and on into the canal where she will be put up for the winter.

Notice that the Cantonia would come up today came as a great surprise to the engineer and fireman at the bridge as it was thought by them that the David Tipton which came up Monday was the only tardy one on the river.

Hours of Work.

There was nothing to do but to don the overalls once more and go back to the engine room, down in the deep, cold and gloomy depths under the bridge.

Runs Through Ice.

Leaving Canton, it encountered many difficulties, the chief of which was the mass of ice which was skimming around on the surface of the stream for the first time in the year.

Ice in Canal.

In a short time the lock was reached and at this place the gates were opened by hand, the machinery there having been securely fixed for the cold months so that it could not be operated again until an immense amount of work was put on it.

CASE IS OPENED TODAY

Jury Drawn and Attorneys Made Arguments This Morning—City Marshal is Defendant.

Court attaches, attorneys and spectators look for a pretty legal battle in the case of John W. Collins versus Marshal Henry Kesselring, now on before Judge H. Bank, Jr., in the district court.

Acted as Highwayman.

Declaring that Marshal Kesselring had acted the part of a highwayman, having robbed the plaintiff of certain keys at the instigation of James A. Porter, Dan F. Miller summed up what he would attempt to prove in the case.

Porter's Arrest.

That Marshal Kesselring in company with James A. Porter, an officer and the jailer, drove to the saloon in West Keokuk after Porter had come to the police station and requested that saloon keys be secured from Collins.

Avers Plaintiff Was Drunk

Avering that the plaintiff was drunk, that he had threatened to keep the saloon open contrary to law and making other allegations as to the plaintiff's action on the night in question, Major Collins, in his opening argument to the jury, stated that Marshal Kesselring had acted entirely within his authority as an officer and was only serving to keep peace and quiet among the citizens.

Men on Jury.

DR. COOK TO BE NEAR HERE

Discoverer of the North Pole Has Been Engaged as one of the Attractions at the Farmington Chautauqua Next Year.

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Representative of the Explorer was in Farmington and Completed Arrangements for His Appearance.

[Special to The Gate City.] FARMINGTON, Iowa, Dec. 8.—Dr. Cook, the north pole discoverer, is scheduled to be at the Farmington chautauqua, August 7, 1910, the local association having secured a contract to that effect last night.

The Chautauqua board completed its organization for the coming year last night, selecting Howard C. Knapp, of Warren and Rev. J. W. Carson to fill vacancies on the board.

A representative of Dr. Cook was present and offered to date the Arctic explorer for Sunday August 7, with no other dating with any of the competing chautauques. Farmington will therefore be the only southeastern Iowa chautauqua offering Dr. Cook during August 1910.

The program committee also contracted with the Redpath-Slayton bureau for the following talent: Thomas P. Gore, the blind senator from Oklahoma, Ex-Congressman J. Adam Bede, Judge Allen, the Boston jurist, Dr. College of the Armour Institute, Chicago; Leonora M. Lake of St. Louis, a noted Catholic female orator, Thomas Brooks Fletcher, famous in his "Mastery of Fools," John E. Guncle, "The Toledo Newsboy," Chas. E. Taggart, Sylvester Lang, Adrian M. News (third booking in Farmington), The Spanish Orchestra, the Musical Makers, and Chaplain Carney. The latter will be the bible man and platform manager. Other musical attractions are yet to be dated.


