GREAT CAMPAIGN COMING SOON

Charles R. Drumm, One of the International Workers of the Y. M. C. A. to Come Here.

GREATEST OF ITS KIND

Mr. Drumm Coming Here From Canada on His Way to Panama Where he Will Conduct Meetings.

Those who are behind the movement, say that it will be the greatest campaign of its kind ever held in Keokuk. Plans for the work and a general prospectus of what may be expected during the campaign were given out after several months of thought and study on the part of the directors and officers of the Y. M. C. A.

From the 27th to the 30th, inclusive of this month, there will be a series of meetings, committee meetings, religious meetings, talks to men in a heart to heart, business way and many other features which are bound to make the campaign a memorable one.

The principal feature and speaker for the four days will be Charles R. Drumm, one of the international Y. M. C. A. workers who comes to this city directly from Canada, where for the past two or three years, he has been conducting a series of strenuous, telling campaigns and his fame as a speaker and organizer is wide spread.

To sum it up and present it to the public, the real object of the meetings which are to be held is to get 150 workers out, sifted out of the city and to "do things" in the future for civic and spiritual betterment.

To do this the services of Mr. Drumm have been secured. He has a knack of talking to men in a way to make them understand him and the work he presents to them. From his meetings with the various committees are expected to come great things and the members of these different bodies will be better prepared to act than ever.

Drumm's success has been phenomenal. He is known all over the country. After leaving Keokuk, he will go directly to the Isthmus of Panama where he will conduct a great campaign.

On January 30 there will be a mass meeting in the Grand opera house for men which is expected to be one of the largest ever held. It is expected that the churches of the city will lend their every assistance in making the campaign a rousing one. It will practically be the first work along all religious lines ever conducted in the city.

JOHN MACEAVITT, IRISH SCHOLAR

Brooklyn Daily Eagle Contained Quite Interesting Sketch of Life of Former Keokuk Scholar.

HE HAD MANY FRIENDS

Was Well Acquainted With Two Secretaries of War—Was Also Contributor to Irish Publication.

The Brooklyn Daily Eagle contained quite an interesting sketch of the life of John MacEavitt, the former Keokuk citizen, whose death was noted in the columns of The Gate City only a few days ago.

John MacEavitt, father of Drs. John C. and James MacEavitt, Elizabeth MacEavitt and Mary Auwerda, died at his home, 407 Clinton street, aged eighty-nine years.

He was an intimate friend of Secretary of War Belknap, both of whom hailed from Keokuk. He remained there until 1886, when he retired and came East to live with his son, Dr. MacEavitt.
