The religious work committee reported that they had made a partial investigation of the missions in the city but had not obtained sufficient information to give an authoritative report.

The Christian Brotherhood sent to the meeting a resolution passed by them which was as follows: "Resolved that we request our representatives to the Federation Council to urge the Federation of Organized Laymen at its next meeting to formulate a plan for the organization of a Civic Union composed of representatives from all churches in the city, or other organizations having the welfare of the city at heart, which union shall investigate and make public if it deems best the character and qualifications of all candidates for municipal offices together with a statement of the pledges said candidates have made or failed to make regarding law enforcement and civic morality."

The civic committee of the Federation recommends that the Federation take upon itself to provide the means for the election of a citizens committee, said committee to be elected at a general city election or primary and to act as the official head of the citizen body of the community.

The committee proposed by the civic committee was to be representative not only of the churches but of everybody in town. They plan for a committee to take the place of the committee of seven, which was in existence during the summer.

It was then proposed that the Federation take up the work of getting a complete census of the city on April 15th by means of the members in each block. It was suggested that the Commercial club had already talked of such a plan and the civic committee was ordered to talk with them and act in the matter as they thought best.

Rev. Potter presented to the committee a plan of an interdenominational lookout committee which he recommended to be tried for six months. It was estimated that this would cost in the neighborhood of \$300 of which about half had already been subscribed.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
