\$100,000 MINERALS IN STATE OF IOWA

Seventeen hundred Lee county miners have signified their acquaintance with the shooting irons and their desire to pursue the ferocious wild beasts of this neighborhood by donating one dollar each to the state of Iowa for a permission slip which is really a gentle reminder of the many processes necessary before the privilege of hunting is really granted.

With the near approach of the duck season, which always guarantees its share of the winter's sport, the appointment of a state game warden from the many candidates for that office and the increasing state license fund, the interest of the hunters is being fully aroused.

The sportsmen of Iowa are closely following the trend of affairs and are awaiting an announcement of the means to be employed in the expenditure of the large sum, now aggregating \$100,000, received in license fees from the shooters of the Hawkeye state.

The general impression prevails that a game farm, modelled after that maintained by the state of Illinois, would prove a valuable adjunct to the shooting of the state.

The introduction of the Hungarian partridge and the Chinese pheasant is urged by many of the sportsmen. These birds are hardy and adapted to stand the cold winters of Iowa.

WOULD KEEP RICHE AT ROCK ISLAND Congressmen So Petition the War Department, Requesting that He Remain for Another Year.

The following dispatch from Washington, D. C., tells of efforts being made by Iowa and Illinois congressmen to have Major Riche retained at his post in Rock Island as head of the United States army engineers in charge of river improvements in this district:

"Representatives Hull, Dawson, Pickett, Kennedy and Haugen, with Lowden and Graft of Illinois, called on the secretary of war and chief of engineers, General Marshall, today and urged that Major Riche be not transferred to Detroit for at least one year. They represented that the improvement of the upper Mississippi river ought to be given under way first and also the survey of the Des Moines river.

"General Marshall who has the deciding of the matter, did not promise that Major Riche could stay on his present detail with headquarters at Rock Island, but did say that even if he were sent to Detroit he would have the supervision of the survey of the Des Moines river.

"Iowa members will still seek to have Major Riche remain in the Rock Island district, but may not succeed."
