



### WARNING TO PEOPLE OF THIS VICINITY

In Case the Powder Works Blows Up, the Wreckage Still Belongs to the Company.

WILMINGTON, Del., March 23.—It is a crime in Delaware for the owner of a farm to sell anything that may be blown three miles onto his place because of a powder explosion.

This was decided when William I. Hedley was arraigned in the municipal court here for the larceny of a large quantity of iron. The metal had been blown on his property as a result of a serious explosion at the Dupont Powder works, and he sold it. He was held for trial at the Newcastle county court.

Judge Cochran of the municipal court ruled that this was larceny within the law. The case is the first of its kind ever brought up in this state.





Annual Business Meeting Held Last Evening and Same Officers Were Re-elected for Ensuing Year


### PRICE OF BROWNS GAME
