

TWO BOHEMIANS MADE BIG STEAL

Joe Kolow and Tathier Prell, Employed at McManus & Tucker Stone Quarry May Have Taken Money

TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS

With Several Suits of Clothing, Shoes and Other Articles Taken From Bunkhouse Yesterday.

Two hundred dollars in money, four suits of clothes, ranging in price from \$15 to \$25, four pairs of dress shoes, two suits of underwear, one pair of trousers, two caps and two razors.

The above is the list of articles composing the booty, stolen from the bunkhouse of the McManus and Tucker Quarry Company at Tlingler station yesterday morning between the hours of seven and twelve o'clock, noon.


The two men suspected of taking the money and wearing apparel are Joe Kolow and Tathier Prell, two foreigners, Bohemians it is thought. The two men had worked at the quarry for about a week and it is supposed had become familiar enough with the secreting places of the money of the other workmen of the camp to go about the theft in a quick and knowing manner yesterday.

Sheriff Makes Search. Immediately after learning of the theft at noon yesterday, the officers of the McManus and Tucker Quarry works, notified Deputy Sheriff J. J. Crimmins of the fact that the personal property of their workmen had been stolen. Sheriff Crimmins immediately went to Ballinger Station where he made a search of the bunkhouses, and outbuildings, also the house of a colored woman who lives next to the bunkhouse which is used by the men for sleeping and eating purpose.

Several of the windows next to the house in which the negro woman lives, were broken out with rocks, the rock being found in the room. A thorough search was made but no money or other hidden articles, except which the men had tucked away themselves were found.

Men Disappeared. Kolow and Prell quit work on Wednesday and were thought to have left the camp for good. Yesterday morning the money and articles of clothing were missing and the two foreigners were suspected of having made off with the loot. The deputy sheriff was not informed until after he had made a search of the bunkhouses and other surrounding property yesterday, thought, that the two men had quit

Many of the men at the quarry bunkhouse keep their money in pillows and hide it in various places throughout the room. Prell and Kolow who had become familiar enough with these hiding places during their stay of a week, are without a doubt in the minds of the officers, the men who took the money.

The Only Clue.

The only clue in the possession of Sheriff Crimmins is a slight one, three keys, attached to a key-ring and belonging to Kolow, one of the men who disappeared.

Both of the Bohemians were tramps of the first order and were like nomads, wandering here and there and not staying in any one place more than a few days at a time.
