—Burlington Gazette: The steamer Illinois was in port today, bound for Rock Island. State Bacteriologist Richardson of Illinois is on board and is making a test of the waters of the Mississippi to ascertain the relative food value of the water for fish spawn, as compared with the Illinois river. Every few miles the water is put through a testing machine and a record is being made. The state of Illinois gives considerable more attention to fish than does Iowa or any other state. The Illinois will remain here until tomorrow morning.

—Fort Madison Gem City: The conference held Tuesday in this city by Patrick J. Kieran, with Samuel Atlee and D. A. Morrison, came to a satisfactory conclusion. Mr. Kieran stated positively that he had secured all the capital he required to carry out and finance all the enterprises he now has in hand. The funds have been secured and nothing can transpire that will change the condition of things. The proposition to take over the street railway line was discussed and a satisfactory understanding in relation to the property was reached. The option now being held by other parties will expire on June 21, and if they do not take over the line Mr. Kieran will secure the property.

—The Globe-Democrat has the following to say about the son of a former pastor of the Westminster church of this city, who was here during the eighties. Rev. Frank Cleland of Anchorage, Ky., has accepted the office of assistant to Rev. Dr. S. J. Nicolls, pastor of the Second Presbyterian church. Mr. Cleland is a graduate of McCormick Seminary, and his father and grandfather were Presbyterian ministers. Mr. Cleland has been in the ministry about eight years, and is said to have ability and power as a preacher. He is unmarried. He will have charge of the Second church, while Dr. Nicolls is on his vacation, and is to arrive next week. Dr. Nicolls has not set the date of his departure.

—Counsel for John Junkin, the negro murderer, says there is no way of knowing when he will hang in the Ft. Madison prison until the Iowa supreme court rules on his appeal. If the appeal is ignored and the verdict of the lower court is affirmed, then the governor must set the time for the execution, which shall not be earlier than the last Friday in July, and may be as much later as decided upon. Again there is the possibility that the governor will not set the date at all but permit Junkin to serve time even though the higher court does affirm. In Kansas there are ten or more convicted murderers who have not been sent to the gallows by the governor not fixing the date. It might be so in the Junkin case. Should the higher court grant the appeal for a new trial then the sentence is vacated and Junkin will have another chance to escape the gallows.


