—The Mexican musical trio, Le Ora Venetta, the singing, dancing and character impersonator, and Harvey G. Hull in character and illustrated songs is a big bill at the Air Dome tonight.

—Weather conditions in Iowa during the last week have boomed crops. If favorable weather is experienced during September, record crops will be harvested, according to the statement of Dr. George M. Chappel, section director.

—Word has been received here of the marriage of Miss Thressa Green, of New York City, who has made Keokuk her home for the past year. She was married in New York City yesterday to Mr. Guido Guiduli, the famous whistler of Berlin, Germany. They will travel for two years and then will make their future home in Berlin.

—Dr. Irvin Gore, a pharmacist of Des Moines, yesterday declared that the report which is being made on infantile paralysis by the state board of health bears him out in the theory that the disease is caused by worms eating through the lining of the stomach and attacking the spinal chord.

Dr. Gore declares that the reason that the disease is prevalent at this time of year is because so many children eat the half stale fruit shipped here from the south and west, causing children's common complaint which before the physician is called has developed into infantile paralysis.

—Harry Lepper, a young employe of the Three M Works, at Monmouth, Ill., met death in a most horrible form yesterday afternoon shortly before 4 o'clock at the big sewer pipe plant east of the city. Lepper was employed to wheel clay from the pit to the mixer, which grinds up the dirt and mixes it with water for the moulds.

While resting on the rail guarding the mixing pan, the young man lost his balance and fell under the heavy wheels in the pan. A short time afterward the machinery was stopped and the mangled remains taken out, death having been almost instantaneous.

—Several years ago a diver was brought to Canton, Mo., for some special work and lost his life under the water, the tragedy being remembered by many Keokuk people. —or twelve hours he was under the water and he lived six hours after being taken out. A diver from Burlington was secured and released the unfortunate man, whose heavy lead shoes had been caught in the river bottom.

The Burlington diver loosened the shoes and they were left in the river bottom. Yesterday considerable interest was aroused among the people of Canton when the shoes were found near the mouth of some large drainage pipes.

—Norris Pyle met Norris King in their scheduled bout on the tennis court of the Athletic field last evening in a battle that was spectacular and thrilling from start to finish. King was given a handicap of twelve yards in the first half and all he could make on an over throw at first or third base but all was of no avail as Pyle was declared winner of the first set by the score of 6-1.

In the second round King played closer to bogy but Pyle showed up extra strong at the finish, winning with a score of 6-4. King begged hard for a return match and another chance at the title but he was told by Pyle to go out and meet some of the second rate artists at the game and if he could return with a good string of victories a second match would be considered.

—Quincy Herald: The warrant that Birdie Abernathy swore out yesterday for the arrest of her husband is not likely to be served. Abernathy is supposed to be in Keokuk and his wife is supposed to be there hunting for him. He has relatives in that city. The fact developed during the day, yesterday, that Abernathy hired a colored boy to take his wife's trunk across the river in a skiff and he boarded a train at West Quincy, checking the trunk as his own. His wife learned what he had done and left for Keokuk about noon. Since then nothing has been heard from her. She had sworn out a warrant charging Abernathy with assault. Abernathy probably knew what she had done and decided to skip out to avoid an appearance in the police court. The couple are strangers here and are said to be vaudeville performers with street fairs and other cheap places of amusement. On the stage Abernathy is called "Billy Allen."


