E., tonight at Elks' hall, Sixth and Main street. Visiting Elks invited. -In consideration of \$800 C. L. Laws has transferred to J. B. Van Pappelendam the west 1/2 of lot 3, block 28, Kilbourne addition. -Regular meeting of racketeetuck encampment No. 7, I. O. O. F., at Odd Fellows' hall at 8 o'clock tonight. Visiting brethren fraternally invited to attend. -A special preparatory service in advance of the communion will be held in Westminster Presbyterian church tomorrow evening, beginning at 7:30, instead of 8:00 o'clock, as has been the hour for evening services since May. -Owing to an accident at the plant last night, the street arcs were not turned on until about 11 o'clock and the streets were as dark as a box of shoe polish. The sky was cloudy and it was almost impossible to see six inches ahead. -Keokuk lodge, No. 256, A. O. U. Lee, ex-county recorder of Van Buren county, who was on trial for wife desertion, was sentenced to one year in the penitentiary by Judge Vermillion at Keosauqua, yesterday. He left on the 11 o'clock train with Sheriff Jamison for the Fort Madison penitentiary. Lee's case was sensational and attracted considerable attention. He was arrested in Chicago last spring. He deserted his wife about three years ago. -Burlington Gazette: G. E. Maxwell, manager of the Burlington Quarry Co., was in the city yesterday. He states his company is doing a rushing business this season. They have shipped in about fifty car loads of crushed stone for the new hotel and about twenty-five more will be required. The company is shipping about four car loads a day to Centerville and three a day to Albia. This company has on hand the building of a \$640,000 levee at Kansas City this season. -Government officials are now at Muscatine and for the past week have been working in front of the city getting the velocity of the river during this exceedingly low stage of water. The steamer Gardie Eastman is assisting along the shore. The officials have never had a chance to work and obtain data at such a low stage of water and the records which will be compiled will be of great value to the navigators of the upper Mississippi river both now and in the future. -Leon F. Rock, the new instructor of mathematics in the high school and coach of athletics, arrived in the city yesterday. He is in Donnellson today looking after matters in connection with his certificate. Mr. Rock is married and will make Keokuk his home. He is a graduate of the Michigan State Teachers' College. One part of the course of that institution is instruction on athletics with the view point of coaching. Mr. Rock has had this course together with practical experience in foot ball, baseball, basket ball, and indoor athletics. He will start with the high school foot ball team next Tuesday afternoon. -Fort Madison Democrat: Case No. 3240, injunction, Vallie Beck versus William Reimbold, has been set for trial at the district court for next Tuesday. In the original petition the plaintiff prays the court for a temporary writ of injunction restraining the defendant as county treasurer from advertising for sale or selling the plaintiff's lots. Nos. 626, 627 and 628, for delinquent taxes, and from attempting in any manner to force the collection of any alleged and attempted special assessment by the city of Fort Madison against the lots for the improvement of the street on which the lots abut; that on the final hearing the alleged and attempted special assessment may be decreed cancelled; that the injunction be perpetual, and that the plaintiff may have such other and further relief as may be just and equitable in the premises and as to equity belongs.

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
