Harry E. Dill Goes to Lincoln, Nebr., as General Manager of Clarinda Poultry, Butter & Egg Co.

WALTER SHAW RISES

Rise of Latter Young Man in Past Four Years is Gratifying to His Many Interested Friends.

To take effect immediately comes the announcement from the S. P. Pond company, the largest concern of its kind in the country, that Walter Shaw is to succeed Harry E. Dill as manager of the creamery department, a position carrying with it responsibility and is relatively lucrative.

Next Wednesday, Mr. Dill who has been connected with the Pond company for the past five years as creamery manager, leaves for Lincoln, Neb., where he has accepted the position as general manager of the Clarinda Poultry, Butter and Egg Co. The transfer to further western headquarters was made by W. T. S. White, president of the S. P. Pond company, and head of other like concerns.

Dill's Successor.

In selecting Walter Shaw to fill the vacancy made by the transfer of Harry E. Dill to the Nebraska house, the officials of the S. P. Pond company are confident that they could not have made a wiser choice. Mr. Shaw has been with the Pond people for two past three and a half years and has made good in every sense of the term. Starting in at the bottom of the ladder and working his way from a small position in the egg room to manager of the creamery in so short a time speaks well of the integrity and business push that is in his make up. As manager he will have entire charge of the creamery, attend to the buying in that department and superintending generally.

He first commenced work for the S. P. Pond company here in April, 1907. In July, that year, he was promoted to assistant foreman of the picking room and in February, 1908, through noticeable efforts he was again given a promotion, this time being made creamery foreman.

Last March Mr. Shaw was given Iowa, Illinois and Missouri territory in which to represent his house while in the capacity of traveling salesman. His latest promotion came the first of this month and is a glad bit of news to many friends here who are interested in his advancement, which has been little short of wonderful though undoubtedly deserved, and that he will prove the right man in the responsible position to which he has been elevated, is certain.







MORE PUPILS IN KEOKUK SCHOOLS

Increased Attendance of Children During the First Week of the Public Schools Over Last Year.

SHOWS THE POPULATION

The Fifth and Sixth Wards Have the Largest Increase, Indicating Growth of the City at its Edges.

At the end of the first week there were forty-nine more children in the Keokuk schools than at the same time last year, according to reports of attendance made yesterday by Superintendent Aldrich.

Of eight schools, five had an increase in attendance, and three showed a decrease as compared with last year at the same time. The greatest increase was in the Carey school, in the sixth ward which alone had more than half the total increase in the city. Whether this is due to special compliance with Roosevelt's anti-race suicide propaganda of five years ago, or to increased population in that part of town from people moving in, does not appear.

The next greatest increase was in the Torrence school, at Fifteenth and High streets, and the increase at Carey and Torrence combined is a half dozen more than the total increase in the city, the efforts of these school districts to increase the population being offset by the laxity in this regard of the Wells and Prices Creek schools where there was a decrease in attendance of a dozen children. Eight less pupils in the high school make the total decrease number 20, while the total increase number is 69, the net increase being 49.

Totals for the first week of 1910 show an increase of 69 pupils over the same time last year. Logically, this showing indicates an increase in population in Keokuk, especially marked in the fifth and sixth wards which are on the edge of the city away from the rivers which limit expansion on other sides.
