

# HAS AEROPLANE ALMOST FINISHED

Iowa Man Expects to Make His First Flight in Ten Days

## HIS SECOND MACHINE

Sold the First One and Now Has a Better One About Completed and Ready to Launch

A. J. Cronkhite of Cedar Rapids is an aeroplane enthusiast who threatens to put Iowa on the aviation map with the flying machine which he is building.

Cedar Rapids is soon to become a flying machine city and citizens who have never before seen these giant birds sailing through the air will be given an opportunity to gratify their curiosity right at home.

That the machine will be a success is no question with Mr. Cronkhite as he has constructed one rather crude machine and taken a flight that was in every way a success and with the finer work that he has put on his new machine it is going to be a sure enough flyer.

"Light Wing" is the name of his monoplane and its construction is thoroughly demonstrated in its appearance. When equipped the machine will not exceed 180 pounds in weight, and minus the engine, a gasoline tank and propelling blades, can be lifted with one hand.

The construction of the machine is of the finest quality ash, entirely free from knots that might tend to weaken, with the exception of the support bar which is of hollow steel.

It is between the main support and the backbone, or support of the wings that the rider has his seat which is of leather and fastened to the lower portions of the main frame.

The tension of the machine is regulated by means of a similar wire cable three thirty-seconds of an inch in size which weighs 9 3/4 pounds to the hundred feet and can stand a strain of 950 pounds.

The power that operates the machine is derived from an 18 horse power engine which is capable of keeping 100 per cent pressure all the time.

The "Light Wing" will lift itself from the ground at a speed of 24 miles an hour and therefore can be elevated in a very short distance.




