



## LEE COUNTY SHOWS BIG LOSS

Director Durand Sends Figures to The Gate City Which Show That County Has Suffered Big Decrease.

### HAS KEOKUK HELPED?

The Loss Must be Charged Somewhere and it May be That Fort Madison Will Show Loss—Other Census Figures.

If Lee county has lost 3,017 in population during the past ten years—and it did according to a special dispatch received by The Gate City from E. Dana Durand, director of the census, late Saturday afternoon—then the question is, did Keokuk play a part in this decrease?

Nearly every citizen in Keokuk will answer this question with a NO, for there is no reason to believe that the city has gone back during the past ten years of its life.

If Keokuk has not contributed to the loss then Fort Madison, our northern neighbor, may be a loser, for such a big decrease would hardly be confined to the agricultural districts.

Keokuk people are anxiously awaiting the announcement from Director Durand regarding its population, but a majority of citizens are of the opinion that a slight increase will be shown.





### 19 HOURS FROM CRIME TO PRISON

Record Case in Iowa Federal Court—Convicted For Stealing Mail Sack.

Nineteen hours from the commission of the deed to the time of leaving for the federal prison with a one year's sentence for stealing a U. S. mail sack is the record of the Creston federal court of Thursday in the case of Ray Morris of Clarinda, Iowa. Those who have berated the American courts for their lingering methods while praising the English courts and exemplifying the Cripple trial, may find in the Morris case the possibilities of the United States wheels of law. Besides we understand the Cripple case has been appealed.

About 7 o'clock Wednesday evening the Q train pulled into Prescott, Iowa, Morris, who had been discharged from his position at the Clarinda insane asylum for cruelty to inmates, picked up one of the mail sacks on the platform and made off with it. It so happened that Bruce Seaman, formerly of Burlington and now railroad detective, and a postal inspector were on the train. They gave chase and overtook Morris, arresting him. The prisoner was taken on to Creston and was bound over by the grand jury at 9 o'clock the next morning. Pleading guilty, he was given a year's sentence at 2 o'clock in the afternoon and hustled off to Ft. Leavenworth.
