SKIES IN 1911 FULL OF INTEREST

Year Will Differ Greatly From That Just Closed in Regard to Heavens and its Bodies.

SATURN THE BEAUTIFUL

Is the Only Planet Which Will be Seen to Advantage in January—An Instructive Study.

The year 1911 will be a most interesting one for those who enjoy watching the heavens. Except at its very beginning two bright planets will always be visible in the evening sky, and at one time no less than four may be seen at once. This is in strong contrast to the year which has just ended, during the greater part of which the brighter planets all were morning stars. The aspects of those beautiful bodies as they change their positions with reference to each other and move over the heavens among the stars, will be most interesting and striking even to those who know but little about astronomy.

During the whole of January the only bright planet in a favorable position in the early evening is the beautiful Saturn, which shines out high up in the heavens, a little west of the meridian. But already the far more brilliant Venus has really appeared, and as it climbs steadily upward among the stars it will grow brighter and brighter, until it far exceeds in brilliancy any other object in the heavens. At this time many inquirers will ask the astronomers and the newspapers to tell them what the very bright star which is shining in the west.

On January 1, Venus is so small a distance to the east of the sun that it sets only 38 minutes after sunset, and even by the end of the month it will have moved out so little that this time is only increased about one hour. It may then be seen shining in the twilight glow, low down, near the ground in the southwest. But after this its motion becomes very rapid, and by July it has mounted so high that it is seen for more than three hours after sunset. It attains its greatest brightness on August 10, and soon after this runs so rapidly toward the sun again that by September 15 it passes to the right of this body and becomes a morning star. On October 22 it attains its greatest brilliancy in the morning sky.

As Venus mounts up the western heavens, Saturn will be seen steadily sinking. For a few days they will draw nearer to each other until on March 29, Saturn will pass below and to the west of Venus. Soon afterward the beautiful ringed planet will move to the west of the sun and become a morning star. During September, however, it will again return, and will be seen entering the evening sky in the east just as the bright Venus is leaving it in the west. Throughout the entire year the rings of Saturn will appear to steadily widen out, until they seem to nearly enclose the entire ball of the planet.

The planet Jupiter, with its retinue of bright little moons moves into the evening sky in the southeast during March, and from then until November this beautiful world remains with us. At first Jupiter will be seen in the southeast and Venus in the northwest. During June, Jupiter will pass to the west of the meridian, and by August 16, on which date Venus is most brilliant, it will have drawn with it, in only three hours of the latter planet. Before it can overtake it, however, Venus will enter the evening sky.

The red planet Mars begins the year as a morning star and moves so slowly westward that it cannot be seen in the early evening until October. It will then be a very conspicuous object, low in the northwest, and by the end of the year it will shine out most brilliantly in the south. By this time Jupiter and Venus will have both disappeared, but Saturn will again have entered the evening sky. A remarkable approach of Mars and Saturn will occur on August 16. The two bodies will then seem to be so close together in the heavens that they will look like a brilliant double star. On November 24, Mars will attain its least distance from earth, and it will, therefore, at this time be most favorably situated for observations.

He intends to visit Keokuk in May and his many friends here will be pleased to renew their acquaintance with him.

Fortune is smiling on him in more ways than one, for he is not only enjoying a successful practice in the west but is in line for a share of an inheritance of a three million dollar estate left by his father, the following clipping from the Journal of Reno telling of the bequest:

Dr. A. A. Cavagnaro of this city has come into a big inheritance, the result of the final distribution of the estate of his father, Carlo Cavagnaro, a pioneer of San Francisco, who died in 1884, but the estate has remained in litigation until this time, when a settlement has been agreed upon.

The property left by the deceased amounts to \$1,500,000 worth of San Francisco real estate, in addition to which there is cash and negotiable securities amounting to as much more.
