

SIX AUTOISTS HIT IN INFORMATIONS

Prominent Owners and Several Drivers of Keokuk Are Charged With Violation of Speed Ordinance.

HAILED INTO COURT

Will be Asked to Appear and Answer to Informations—Mysterious Lady Driver Has Narrow Escape.

As the opening gun of what promises to be a persistent crusade against speeding automobilists of Keokuk, informations were filed in the superior court Saturday afternoon against six drivers and drivers. The defendants named are the following: B. B. Hobbs, Dr. F. B. Dorsey, Dr. C. R. Armentrout, Edgar Roberts and Arthur Ericson drivers for the Water Power Company, W. E. Flannigan.

Alleged Violation. Edgar Roberts is charged with exceeding the speed limit Saturday in driving up North Fourth street and is credited with making better than fifteen miles an hour as permitted by law. He is named in a separate information.

The second information charges B. B. Hobbs, Dr. Dorsey and Arthur Ericson with exceeding the speed limit of ten miles an hour on Main street Saturday.

The third information names Dr. Armentrout and W. E. Flannigan with violation of the city ordinance relative to speeding on Main street, Friday. Flannigan is credited with the fastest time, according to Chief Henry Schevers, who, together with an officer, did the timing. The chief's watch caught him going at about a twenty-mile-an-hour clip.

Notables Escape. Two notables, one Chief Engineer Hugh L. Cooper of the Water Power Company, and the other a prominent lady driver of the city, are said to have escaped summons by a narrow margin. It is reported that the chief's watch suffered a mishap in timing the engineer between Fifth and Sixth at 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon, this being all that saved the autoist. The lady driver piloting an "E. M. F." was caught exceeding the speed limit, but a well made it impossible to carry out the identity and she was not included in the list.

The timing of the autoists was done Friday and Saturday by Chief Schevers, who was stationed at Sixth and Main street, with another officer of the force on the corner of Seventh, just 440 feet distant. The autoists, according to mathematical calculations are permitted to make this run in thirty seconds.

Fine From \$1.00 to \$25.00. The defendants are charged with a violation of the city ordinance which says: "No person shall drive or operate any vehicle on the streets or other highways of the city of Keokuk at a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper, having due regard to the traffic and use of the highways, or so as to endanger the life or limb of any person on Main street, in said city at a greater rate than one mile in six minutes or elsewhere in said city at the rate of one mile in four minutes."
