

### STIRRING POT IN VOTE PROBE

It is said that Clerks and Judges in Second and Sixth Wards Will Be Given a White-washing.

### EXPLANATIONS FAULTY

Witnesses Put Blame on Clerical Errors, When Questioned About the Straight Ballots.

The ballot box pot will be given another stirring Monday when the grand jury resumes its probe into alleged irregularities and misconduct at the Second and Sixth ward polls last November—and that august body will then dole out a coat of white wash to some ten or twelve judges and clerks who have been put under fire by the investigation. No indictments are expected although it is said that the inquisitorial body has been "wised up" to a marked degree by what it has been able to extract of the witnesses so far. It has leaked out that the inquiry has thrown light upon a veritable war that existed between the republican and democratic judges and clerks in the Second ward which brought about more campaigning within the polls than without.

Friday afternoon the judges and clerks—five in number—were hauled into the grand jury room to be quizzed and their explanations for various discrepancies later discovered by the contest board were about the thinnest testimony the grand jurors had expected.

How eighteen straight democratic ballots with the exception of a vote for Chambers in the recordership were counted as straight democrats is said to have been one of the questions put, and oversight was the only reason assigned.

In a number of instances the tally sheets and returns did not agree. Errors were frequent, but they were all attributed to clerical mistakes.

Monday the Sixth ward judges and clerks are slated for a hearing, and the session is expected to be a repetition of the Friday one.

But a big coat of whitewash is to be applied, and the grand jury body will be generous in its application.

### Saturday in Court.

Closing arguments in the Hewitt-Dunbar case will be resumed and likely concluded when district court is reconvened by Judge W. S. Withrow Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The introduction of evidence in the case was brought to an end Friday afternoon and the closing arguments began Saturday morning, continuing until adjourned. Attorney E. C. Weber opened for the state and Attorney Miller followed in defense. Attorney John E. Craig will close for the defendants on Monday afternoon with County Attorney Craig winding up for the state. The case is being attended by only casual interest.


