

### WRECK TUMBLE IN BURROWS ROW

Three Story, Twenty-foot Portion of Negro Tenement District Collapsed This Afternoon.

### CONDEMNED BUILDING

Phillip Reeves Used Lower Floor for Store Room and Upper Two Stories Were Empty.

With a crash, the Blondeau street end of the famous Burrows Row, on Ninth street, fell at twenty minutes past two this afternoon and landed in a tangled and dirty mass of bricks, mortar and splintered wood.

### Fell With Loud Noise.

Reeves was going to the building at the time it fell, and had reached Eighth and Blondeau when he heard the crashing of the bricks and wood supports of the building giving way.

### Started This Morning.

Early this morning a huge gap was made in the wall on the north end of the building which fell this afternoon.

### One of Oldest in Keokuk.

The building, part of which was ruined this afternoon, was built in the fifties, during the boom and construction work that was going on actively here in '57, it is said.

### Negroes Make Scramble.

Twenty or thirty frightened negroes who heard the north end of the building fall this afternoon, thought the end of the world had come, no doubt, and there was much running about and excitement caused by the tumble down.

### Part of Burrows Row

Part of Burrows Row, which has been lived in the ramshackle for years. Such well known characters as "Professor" Barnes, and others familiar in "dark town" history have been making Burrows Row their home for years.

### The Place Which Fell

The place which fell this afternoon is owned by a colored sister and brother, Mrs. Lydia Smith Johnson and Gerard Smith, two heirs to an estate left them, the property not being divided in construction and owned jointly by the two.

### A Similar Collapse

A similar collapse to the one this afternoon occurred at Ninth and Main about twenty-one years ago when several persons were buried beneath the ruins and later saved by the fire department.

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

### WHY A RESURRECTION?

The Resurrection Doctrine Peculiar to Christianity, but Known to No Other.

What if the Dead Should Not Rise? Would This Affect Christian Faith and Doctrines and Prove Them All False?—Pastor Russell Proves It So.

### London, April 16.

The London Tabernacle was crowded to hear Pastor Russell's Easter sermon on "The Resurrection Hope the Only One." His text was from I Corinthians xv. 12-18.

"How say some among you that there is no resurrection of the dead? ... If Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain and your faith is also vain; ... then they also which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished."

### Now What Do We Find?

When once we see that "the wages of sin is death" and not eternal torment; and that the Bible hell is the tomb and not a fiery furnace; and that all mankind go to *sheol*—to *hades*—just as did our Savior; then we begin to see that what we all need is to be saved from *sheol*, from *hades*, just as the Savior was. A resurrection salvation is thus the hope of the world.

I reply that it is the soul that goes to *sheol*, to *hades*, the grave, the tomb, the state of death. Although the words *sheol* and *hades* are translated *hell*, nevertheless they refer, not to the mound of earth, which is in the nature of a monument, but to the secret, hidden condition, preferably styled the tomb, the abyss.

As the Father raised Him from the dead on the third day, so it is promised that He will raise us, the Church, up from the dead. More than this, the unjust also, those who have not been approved of God in the present life, shall all be awakened from the sleep of death. They will come forth informed respecting sin, having lived under the reign of Sin and Death. They will come forth that they may learn the ways of righteousness, the reward of which is life everlasting.

The glorified Jesus and His glorified Church, the Bride, will be the Royal Priesthood, whose special work for a thousand years will be the uplifting of mankind, not only from the tomb, but also to perfection of life, "every man in his own order" or rank. The uplifting will bless as many as are willing, lifting them up from the degradation and menanness and imperfection, into which all have fallen by one man's disobedience, under the laws of heredity.
