PEACE SCHEME MAKES BIG HIT

France Likes Taft's Idea and Yearns For the Time When She Can Throw Down Arms.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

Country Cannot Very Well Take the First Step But Will be Glad to Fall in Line.

PARIS, April 22.—President Taft's peace scheme has made a tremendous hit in France. This country yearns for the day when she can throw down her burden of arms and let her young men, now in the army, go back to work.

France cannot very well take the lead but she will follow the leader mightily closely. She keeps armed to the teeth principally on account of Germany and once Germany scraps a few of her dreadnaughts and reduces her standing army of nearly 600,000 units to 100,000 or thereabouts, France will be glad enough to do the same. So if Germany and England got together on a peace plan, France and Germany will likely enough do likewise. The truth is, France is eager enough to do such a thing since her army and navy are a tremendous weight for her to carry. Her people, already highly overtaxed, regard with awe the building of new warships and the buying of new war materials. And too, according to statistics, in less than 10 years France's standing army already over 50,000 men smaller than that of her worst enemy, Germany, will have a loss of 20,000 more soldiers to tack on, the small birth-rate being responsible for this. On the other hand Germany's population is increasing about seven per cent a year and in 10 years Germany will have a much bigger standing army than she has today—unless some sort of disarmament treaty can be arranged between the bigger powers.

The famous socialist leader, Jaures, writes: "When several nations have placed themselves outside the possibility of war, partial systems of peace will soon amalgamate with one another. Thus,
