## YALE CREW LEFT FAR IN THE REAR

Cornell Crew Defeated Old Eli and Princeton in Triangular Race.

[Gate City Leased Wire Service.] PRINCETON, N. J., May 20.—The Tiger is celebrating tonight's defeat of his ancient enemy, the bull dog. The blues colors lowered today to Princeton in the first rowing race in which the orange and black has competed in 27 years. Cornell won the triangular race, but the Princetonians did not expect their crew to outrow Courtney's men, and Yale was hopelessly outdistanced.

It was the first intercollegiate regatta ever held on Carnegie Lake. The three varsity crews pulled on almost even terms for half the distance, when the Ithacans forged ahead with Princeton holding the place position. From this time on Yale fell further back, and when Cornell crossed the line two lengths ahead of Princeton, the Yale eight was a dozen lengths in the rear.

Roy Pierce Seems to Have About all the Bad Habits Anyone Could Absorb.

NEWBURGH, N. Y., May 20.—Addicted to forty drinks a day, as high as sixty cigarettes, and the use of morphine, alienists today testified that Roy Pierce, son of the millionaire oil man, Henry Clay Pierce, was not capable of contracting a marriage at the time he was wedded to Miss Bessie Chapman, an actress, November 14, 1910.

The aged father of Roy and his brother, Theron, testified to his disputation and his mental irresponsibility. The father also said that his son told him his wife had wealthy friends in New York, whom she could not afford to cast off unless the Pierce family contributed \$25,000 a year for the support of herself and husband. The court will decide the case Monday.

## LUMBER ADVANCE INVESTIGATION

Action Started Against Half Dozen Kansas City Concerns as Trust.

LOUIS, May 20.—To give evidence in an ouster suit filed by Attorney General Major in the Missouri supreme court, representatives of six Kansas City lumber companies, alleged members of a lumber trust, will appear Monday before R. M. Reynolds, special commissioner in this city. Former Justice Gant of the supreme court is retained as special counsel by Attorney General Major.

The state alleges the lumber dealers are operating in restraint of trade similar to that developed in the suit against the beef trust. The yellow pine dealers' association of St. Louis is the principal defendant. The Kansas City companies are: The Central Coal & Coke Co., Pickering Lumber Co., Missouri Land & Live Stock Co., and three others whose identity is not known tonight. The price of yellow pine lumber has advanced \$3 since December 1, despite a reported overproduction at the mills.

Number of Candidates Will Be Put Through Degree Work of the Order.


