TONSORIAL SHOP OF PERFECT PLAN

Otto Rockenbach's Toilet Artists to Wear White Uniforms—Handsome Shop Opens Monday.

Monday morning at the usual hour, "The Model," 521 Main street, the finest barber shop in Keokuk and one equal in its appointments and fixtures to the best tonsorial establishments of the metropolitan cities, will open its doors to the male population of this city.

The regalia will be entirely white, including trousers and coat.
