TRANSPORTING OF TURBINE PARTS

Mississippi River Company Has Overcome Shipping Difficulties in Purchase of Expensive Machinery.

LARGEST IN THE WORLD

Thirty Turbines Will be Installed in Power House Here at a Cost of About a Million and a Half.

Difficulty anticipated by the Mississippi River Power Company in the shipment of electric turbines to be used in the power house here which will be the largest in use in the world has been overcome by a design calling for turbines somewhat smaller in dimensions and specially constructed as to parts to meet transportation facilities, according to an announcement made today by the power company.

First Shipment in Two Months.

A good estimate of the enormous size of the turbines is pictured by the dimensions. The turbine wheels will be thirteen feet in diameter and each turbine will weigh 600,000 pounds.
