PRESBYTERIAN SYNOD BEGINS ITS SESSION

Dr. Ensign, Retiring Moderator, Delivered Fine Sermon Last Evening.

BURLINGTON, Iowa, Oct. 18.—With over 200 delegates in attendance the Iowa synod of the Presbyterian church began its annual sessions last night. The sermon by the retiring moderator, Rev. Mr. William B. Sanford, of the Waterloo presbytery, was the feature of the evening's program.

The Presbyterian church on Washington street was filled with delegates and others, but except for the sermon of the moderator the proceedings were almost entirely of a business character. Today's program will be replete with addresses and discussions pertaining to the work of the church, and in the afternoon the delegates will take part in the dedication of the Barhydt chapel at Parsons college, Fairfield.

Retiring Moderator's Sermon.
Rev. Mr. Sanford, of Waterloo, the retiring moderator, said that the ministers had come together in fellowship, realizing what a blessed privilege it is to be co-workers. The clergymen go out in the great infinite love of God, having the confidence to do that which they are called upon to do.
