FARMERS TO BE HEARD THURSDAY

Green Bay Matter Will be up Again in Fort Madison, This Time Before Lee County Supervisors.

COMMISSION TIMBER

Two Well Known Farmers Are Being Prominently Mentioned as Probable Choice, Only One to Serve.

Green Bay farmers living in the proposed drainage district which the Mississippi River Power company is seeking to have established by Lee and Des Moines counties, will be given a hearing by the Lee county supervisors in Fort Madison Thursday before preliminary steps are taken to ascertain the feasibility of such a proposition.

From what can be learned in advance it is believed there is little likelihood in the preliminaries not being carried out. Two men are being mentioned as commission timber and unless the farmers are able to halt the board the supervisors will name the commissioner, as required by law, at the conclusion of the hearing.

The fact that a second county has been joined with Lee in the petition asking for the district makes the law applicable in a different manner. It is necessary for each county to appoint a commissioner. The two commissioners meet and secure a competent engineer who will serve with them as a commission to look into the matter.

The Thursday hearing promises to be attended by as much interest as the recent one held in Fort Madison before Judge Bank. At the last one Judge Bank refused to enjoin the board from taking preliminary steps to the end of forming the district.
