

FARMER TO BE BENEFITED

Power Dam Will Revolutionize Farm Life in This Vicinity, According to a Quincy Story.

TO HAVE USE OF POWER

Can Light Their Homes and Run Machinery With Electricity—What One Farmer Prepares to do.

QUINCY, Ill., Nov. 18.—The building of the new power dam at Keokuk promises to revolutionize farm life in this part of the country and it is expected that some wonderful changes in the manner in which the farmers will live and conduct their farms will take place in the next few years. These changes are especially expected to take place along the line of the transmission trunk to be run from Hamilton along the Illinois side of the river as far south as East St. Louis. It will give the farmers a chance to install electricity into their homes by the use of reducing coils and to use power in running the machinery on their farms at a comparatively small cost. So it can be seen that the farmers will enjoy the privileges of a city and many are already beginning to make preparations for the changes.

At every turn the farmers have been co-operating with the power company and encouraging the proposed transmission line that would furnish them with an abundance of electricity. Right of way for the pole line is being freely given by the county land owners and they are anxiously looking forward to that time when their dwellings may be made as modern as the city homes. A couple hundred warranty deeds have been filed with the recorder which give the Mississippi River Power company access to portions of their farms for the purpose of erecting poles and cables to carry the power from the dam.

As evidence of the farmers intentions to modernize their homes, Francis Campbell, a farmer living near Ursa, is having his new dwelling wired and electric fixtures installed. The house is now nearing completion and is as modern as the city homes. Not only has he installed wiring for electric lights but he has equipped his new domicile with a modern heating plant and modern plumbing throughout.

Mr. Campbell is the first Adams county farmer to prepare for the electric power that will be afforded the rural residents but all over the county farmers are discussing the proposed pole line and many have verbally announced their intentions of wiring their houses and contract for service as soon as active work on the pole line is started.


