

 —The cloth which holds the asbestos paper around the furnace pipes of the Baptist church, caught on fire in two places last evening during the service and the congregation smelled the smoke but there was no panic. After church had been dismissed an investigation was made and a still alarm was answered by the department at 9 o'clock. There was no damage.
 —The Y. W. C. A. course consists entirely of first class musical and dramatic talent, because there is no lecture offered the tickets sell at the low cost of \$1.50 and \$1.25.
 —The state railroad commission has directed Commerce Counsel Henderson to take charge of an investigation of the interstate rate on butter, eggs and poultry out of Iowa. Complaint has been filed with the commission that the railroads are charging two cents more than their published tariffs allow. The complaint was filed by H. A. Rhyneberger of Pella. He declares that practically all of the railroads are giving the Iowa butter, eggs and poultry dealers the worst of it in the matter of freight rates to other states on these products.
 —Governor Carroll has been asked to prevent the destruction of an iron pole which Robert E. Lee and Jefferson Davis erected in northeastern Iowa long before the civil war. The pole marks the boundary line between Minnesota and Iowa and is located near the town of New Albin, in Allamakee county. The pole was erected by the United States government. Lieutenant Robert E. Lee commanded the engineer corps and Lieutenant Jeff Davis the infantry company which had charge of the survey determining the state line and erecting the monuments marking that boundary line. Gravel pits are being dug around the pole, and Ellison Orr of Waukon has asked the governor to take steps to preserve it.
 —Railroads cannot be held to be negligent because they don't attach freight cars containing perishable or sick freight to passenger trains to hasten movement, according to a ruling made by the supreme court. Pine Brothers of Diagonal bought a fine horse at Bushnell, Ill., and shipped it over the Burlington. The freight made the schedule time advertised by the company. The horse became sick en route and Pine Brothers asked the company to attach the car to a passenger train. The company refused and the horse died en route. Pine Brothers sued for the value of the horse, charging negligence by the railroad company. The supreme court says: "The failure to accelerate movement of freight by attaching freight cars to passenger trains cannot be held culpable negligence."
