

IOWA GIRL WEDS A RANCHMAN

Mary B. Perkins of Burlington Becomes Wife of John McIlvain of O-Four-Bar Ranch in Wyoming.

FATHER WAS PROMINENT

Miss Perkins Was Daughter of the Late C. E. Perkins, Founder of the Burlington Railroad.

BURLINGTON, Ia., Nov. 22.—The marriage of Miss Mary B. Perkins, daughter of the late C. E. Perkins, founder of the Burlington railroad system, to Mr. John Grievess McIlvain of O-Four-Bar ranch, Ranchester, Wyo., at her home in this city was the culmination of a happy romance that would make up the theme for another story of "The Virginian."

Liability Limiting Now Held Valid. Any clause in a bill of lading issued by any railroad in Iowa limiting the liability of the company for damages to any class of live stock or freight is invalid.

This is the ruling of the supreme court handed down yesterday. The opinion was given in the suit of Jelsko Cramer against the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific Railroad company. Some of the plaintiff's hogs were killed in transit. It seems the road had a bill of lading through which the shipper could get a lower rate on his hogs if he would sign the liability clause to the effect that he was not to recover more than \$10 per head for injury done his animals.

In summarizing the case the supreme court says: "To be consistent we must hold the stipulations limiting liability invalid, contrary to our statute and opposed to sound public policy. It may be that there should be a general rule applicable to all interstate shipments holding such contracts as are relied upon either valid or invalid in order that the extent of liability may not depend upon the place of contract; but this suggestion has no doubt occurred to members of congress and with full knowledge of the conflict in court decisions they have not seen fit to legislate upon the subject."

AN AEROPLANE ON EACH SHIP

Within Another Year Every American Battleship will Have Flying Machine.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23.—Another year will see the hydro-aeroplane developed to such an extent that each battleship of the American navy may have its own flying machine, in the opinion of Capt. Washington I. Chambers, who has charge of the aeronautical work of the navy department.

Capt. Chambers believes that as soon as a solution is found for the motor problem on which practical aviation experts are now working, the installation of hydro-aeroplanes as a part of the equipment of battleships will be begun.

It is not considered probable that the navy aeronauts will follow the plans of the army and move their equipment south for practice during the winter.

TRIPOLI WILL BE CAPTURED AGAIN

Turks Are Expected to Gain Possession of the City and Oust the Italians.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 23.—The newspapers profess to have information which enables them to predict once more that Tripoli will shortly be retaken by the Turks. The Italians, they say, are in a deplorable position owing to the rain. The floods swept away a whole battalion with the exception of thirty men, and they were unable to land reinforcements and provisions, because of the bad weather. An Italian cruiser is stranded at Bangazi.
