

THE COLUMBIA HAS BEEN SOLD

Second Largest Boat in the Blair Fleet Disposed of to Capt. D. M. Sibley of Peoria.

FAMILIAR CRAFT HERE

Has Piled in and Out of Keokuk for a Number of Years—Will be Removed from the Mississippi.

The excursion steamer Columbia one of the best known excursion steamboats on the upper Mississippi, will no longer plow the waters of the Father of Waters.

The Columbia has been the property of the Blair line, the same company that owns the Keokuk and other boats, and with the exception of the side-wheeler Morning Star, was the largest boat in Blair's fleet.

Captain Blair bought the Columbia at St. Louis five years ago, where she was working as a packet, and equipped her for the excursion trade, remodeling the interior and installing a dance floor in the forward part of the cabin deck.

Whether Capt. Blair will replace the Columbia with another boat has not yet been announced.

The meeting last evening was of the Keokuk Club Realty Company. In a short time the Keokuk Country Club will hold its annual meeting at which time the new president will be asked to name a building committee for the purpose of taking in charge plans for the new club house.

It was said today that an effort will be made to have some of the present subscriptions increased for the purpose of building the new club house as desired. Much of that already secured has been expended in purchasing grounds at a cost of nearly \$10,000.
