An attempt is now being made to establish the valuation of the land condemned. About fifteen witnesses came from the neighborhood of Dallas City yesterday and the examinations are continuing today. This procedure may continue into June at different points in this vicinity.

—Burlington is after the next state democratic convention. The matter of necessary funds is no bar to the city obtaining it, for committees have gone forth and in two hours got enough money to insure the expenses. One of the attractions which could be offered is the Keokuk day. The Gazette explains: The proximity of Burlington to Keokuk, where the big dam is in the course of construction, will be another attraction to delegates. Keokuk is about an hour or two ride from Burlington, along the banks of the beautiful river, and this side trip should serve as an incentive to every delegate to come to this city.

He was a good man and a member of St. Patrick's church. Many knew him and liked him well. The arrangements for the funeral will be announced later.
