

—The "safety first" movement has made considerable progress in this country, but recent figures of the census bureau show that there is still urgent need of education and training to cut down the number of fatal accidents. Steam railroad employees stand at the head of the list in the percentage of deaths from all causes in the total number of deaths from all causes in various occupations, according to the latest reports. Of the number of deaths among steam railroad employees who are in active service, 53.4-10 per cent are due to accidents. This does not mean that more than half of the men employed on railroads died from accidents. The figures merely apply to the number of deaths caused while the men are actively occupied in the operation of railroads, and does not apply to deaths from various causes after the men have left the roads or have been superannuated.
